1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for a review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, taking into account the representation made by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in their capacity as a Responsible Authority. The review was bought under the Crime & Disorder, Protection of Children from harm objectives, Public Nuisance and Public Safety objectives.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1.1 On 31st May 2005 an application was made to Peterborough City Council by Mr Shaid Majid to convert an existing licence to a premises licence under Schedule 8 to the Licensing Act 2003. Following no representations being received from any of the responsible authorities or from any interested party the premises licence was granted. The original authorisations granted were as follows:

Sale of Alcohol: Monday to Saturday – 8am until 11pm

Sunday - 10am until 10.30pm.

Recorded Music: Monday to Sunday – During opening hours

A variation to extend the hours alcohol could be sold at the premises was received on the 23rd May 2006. This variation was subject to mediation after the Police made a valid representation. As a result of mediation the licence was granted on 24th June 2006 with additional conditions being placed on the premises licence. The authorisations granted after this variation were as follows:

Sale of Alcohol: Monday to Sunday – 8am until 2am

Recorded Music: Monday to Sunday – During opening hours

2.2 The original converted licence and the current licence, together with the licence conditions are attached at Appendix B on Page 9 and Appendix C on Page 19

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Cambridgeshire Constabulary, a Responsible Authority, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing.

4.2 Summary of issues raised by Cambridgeshire Constabulary

- i) After a number of test purchasing operations it was found that staff at the premises sold alcohol to underage persons. On three separate occasions (30/9/05, 4/7/07 & 22/1/10) underage volunteers were able to purchase alcohol from the premises without being asked for proof of their age.
- ii) Police continue to receive intelligence that indicates that underage persons are able to purchase alcohol at the premises.
- iii) The premises has been specifically identified by Police on a number of occasions as being responsible for violence, disorder and street drinking in Eastfield Road.

- iv) Insufficient measures are in place at the premises to ensure adherence to the Licensing Act 2003.
- v) The local Neighbourhood Policing Panel have prioritised that both the Neighbourhood Council and Neighbourhood Policing Team must 'ensure businesses comply with licensing laws and promote responsible trading and behaviour in the Eastfield Road area.'

5. Letter of support from Children Services

5.1 Children services have sent a letter of support for the review of the premises licence. This letter is attached at **Appendix F - Page 41** The letter indicates support for the recommendations in the Police's report and also suggests that the premises should adhere to the 'Safeguarding Children Licensable Activities – Good Practice Guidance'.

6. LICENSING OFFICERS COMMENTS

6.1 A mediation meeting between Cambridgeshire Constabulary and the applicant was due to take place in March 2010 but was cancelled by the applicant the day before. The applicant stated that he was unavailable on that date and failed to contact the Licensing Authority to rearrange the meeting.

8. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 8.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by the Cambridgeshire Fire & Rescue Service (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- **8.2** In this case, the application was received at these offices on 12th February 2010.
- 8.3 The application before this committee will consider
 - (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations

- 8.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
 - (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

In addition the guidance issued under Para 11.15 of Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be in issued in writing to the holder of the licence. But, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvements – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Interested parties':

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

Or the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and

• The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time – a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003

'Vicinity': Given the normal everyday meaning of being 'near to' when considering the relevance of representations received from individual's residence or business.

Please state the ground(s) for review (please read guidance note1) I would like to apply for a review of the premises licence with regard to the following objectives of the Licensing Act 2003:

- The protection of children from harm
- The prevention of crime and disorder
- The prevention of public nuisance
- Public safety

This premises has a history of failing test purchasing operations and has been continually recommended for test purchasing operations by Officers who had intelligence to believe that underage sales were taking place to young people in the community.

On the evening of 30th September 2005 a multi-agency team conducted a test purchase operation in the city. A number of premises were targeted after intelligence was received from local officers which stated that the premises were believed to be selling alcohol to underage customers.

Underage volunteers were sent into News N Booze, 95 Eastfield Road and purchased alcohol which was then seized by officers working on the operation.

Furthermore, on the evening of 4th July 2007 a subsequent operation was conducted due to intelligence received from the Neighbourhood Policing Team and members of the public which indicated that underage customers were being sold alcohol at the premises.

On the 4th July 2007 volunteers purchased alcohol twice at the premises. After the alcohol had been purchased it was seized by officers working on the operation.

A further test purchasing operation was conducted at the premises on Friday 22nd January 2010 after intelligence was received to indicate that underage sales were taking place.

At 19:26hrs on Friday 22nd January 2010 volunteers purchased four cans of lager from the premises. The purchase was witnessed by officers from the Police and Peterborough City Council who were taking part in the operation.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

Therefore, following another test purchase failure, the police have serious concerns regarding the ability of staff at this premise to uphold the objectives of the Licensing Act 2003. Furthermore, the police have serious concerns regarding the measures in place at the premises to prevent underage sales which have been proved, through test purchasing operations, to be totally inadequate and ineffective.

The Police also have serious concerns regarding the impact of licensed premises in this area of the community. The current Neighbourhood Policing Panel priorities for this area state that the Neighbourhood Council and Neighbourhood Policing Team must

"ensure businesses comply with licensing laws and promote responsible trading and behaviour in the Eastfield Road area"

The results of test purchasing operations, including the most recent on 22nd January 2010, reveal that this premise is not complying with the Licensing Act 2003 or promoting responsible trading and behaviour by selling alcohol to children. The panel priority was raised on 30th January, shortly after the underage sale on the test purchasing operation, and the police believe that the operation of this licensed premise has contributed to it being raised as a serious community concern.

Crime and disorder incidents for this area also reveal the impact of licensed premises, including News N Booze, on the local community. A number of incidents specifically refer to News N Booze in relation to violence, disorder and street drinking. Street drinking has been raised by the local community as a previous panel priority and is an ongoing community concern in this area.

A summary of recorded rowdy/nuisance, violent and street drinking incidents from 09/02/09-09/02/10 for the Eastfield Road area surrounding the premises can be found below. The incident search was conducted using the postcode of the premises and postcodes in the vicinity of the shop to provide data for both sides of Eastfield Road

- CC-20072009-0592. Local resident reported a group of 10-12 males causing a disturbance in the street at 20:51hrs. Resident reported that local residents experience a lot of problems with the local shops.
- CC-27022009-0683. Local resident reported that a group were causing a disturbance outside the local shops at 22:20hrs.
- CC-27012010-0508. Ambulance crew reporting that a male had been found drunk and incapable at 23:05hrs and was causing a nuisance.
- CC-26122009-0034. Local resident reporting that a drunk male is outside their premises at 02:27hrs.
- CC-10102009-0489. Local councillor reporting a group of 6 individuals aged 16-20yrs drinking on Eastfield Road. Officers attended and dispersed the group.
- CC-17092009-0550. A drunk individual was reported causing a disturbance outside News N Booze Eastfield Road.

- CC-05042009-0637. A fight was reported at 22:51hrs outside the shop
- CC-21112009-0233. A local resident reported 3 street drinkers causing a disturbance and drinking in the area.
- CC-01122009-0461. A local business owner reported a drunk male in the street causing a disturbance.
- CC-06052009-0096. A local resident reported a group of 8 males standing on the street drinking and causing a disturbance.
- CC-09062009-0644. A local resident reported a group of males causing a disturbance in the street at 22:50hrs. The resident reported that they were near to a licensed premise.
- CC-03052009-0607. A local resident reported that a group of youths were causing a disturbance in the street and fighting at 21:59hrs. The resident reported that the group were drinking.
- CC-29072009-0423. A fight was reported inside News N Booze, Eastfield Road.
- CC-20082009-0677. An ambulance crew reported that a male had been assaulted in the street and was drunk.
- CC-11082009-0289. A local resident reported a group of four males street drinking and urinating in the street.
- CC-10082009-0226. A local resident reported a group of people drinking and urinating in the street.

These incidents demonstrate that local residents experience ongoing alcohol related crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of News N Booze Eastfield Road. Whilst it cannot be demonstrated that it is only News N Booze which is contributing to this problem (as other licensed premises can also be found on this section of Eastfield Road), the failure of staff at the premises to prevent underage sales highlights their failure to uphold the objectives of the Licensing Act. Other premises have also been selected for test purchasing operations in this area and have not sold alcohol to underage customers. News N Booze has consistently failed test purchasing operations and sold alcohol to underage customers. The Police Licensing team believe that insufficient measures are in place to uphold the licensing objectives at the premises which has led to underage sales but could also lead to other problems such as sales of alcohol to intoxicated individuals. This act could cause problems currently experienced on Eastfield Road such as street drinking,

collapse and injury to intoxicated individuals which has been highlighted in the incidents listed above by ambulance crew reporting. It is felt by the Police Licensing Team that inadequate measures are in place at News N Booze to sell alcohol legally or responsibly. Furthermore, the incidents listed above demonstrate that alcohol sales in this area are causing significant problems for this community. This is supported by concerns raised by the local community through the panel priority process which has highlighted licensed premises several times as being one of the top problems in this area. The incidents reveal that many of these problems are experienced late at night and the Police Licensing team feel that the late night sale of alcohol has a negative impact on the local community. The Police Licensing team believe that the impact of incidents on the community is also greater late at night when most people are at home in the area and do not wish to be disturbed.

Therefore, with regards to the evidence outlined above. The Police Licensing Team would like to make the following recommendations in relation to this premise licence:

In order to prevent the sale of alcohol to underage customers:

- A Personal License Holder to be present at 95 Eastfield Road at all times during the hours of opening. A minimum of 3 Personal License Holders (excluding the DPS) required at 95 Eastfield Road to ensure full cover during the hours of opening.
- A bespoke training package to be introduced at 95 Eastfield Road to include the following:
- i) Staff to receive training and supervision to ensure that they fully understand their responsibilities in relation to age restricted products, in particular to the sale of alcohol so as to prevent sales to persons under the age of 18 years (Training Records to be made available to any Authorised Officer upon request)

ii) The requirement that sales staff will not undertake sales on the till before they have signed a due diligence sheet indicating that they have understood the various legal provisions – (Training Records to be made available to any Authorised Officer upon request) The Police Licensing team would like to recommend that in order for these measures to be implemented at the shop the premises licence should be suspended for a period of three months. This period will allow staff at the shop to undertake the recommended training in order to uphold the objectives of the Licensing Act 2003. After this three month period, and following a meeting with the Police Licensing team to demonstrate that the works have been undertaken, it may be suitable for the premises to recommence the sale of alcohol. In order to prevent alcohol related crime and disorder in this area and the negative impact that it has on the local community (particularly late at night): The hours for the sale of alcohol at the premises to be reduced to finish at 22:00hrs.

- Ensure staff are aware of legislation and that they are proactively observant of the law and that staff receive recognised server training.
- Familiarise staff with the Portman Group's leaflet "Say No to Underage Drinkers" and the Group's general Code of Practice, and implement this. (available from info@portmangroup.org.uk
- Monitor the vicinity around the premises/event to ensure that children are not pressuring other customers to purchase alcohol for or on behalf of them. You could use CCTV to assist with this.

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine this application for a new-premises licence for Sila which is situated at 50 Eastfield Road, Peterborough, PE1 4AN, taking into account the representations received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary and a local resident as detailed in paragraph 4 of this report.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 A current premises licence is in place for this address. This premises licence is for the Sapphire Club which had been operating as an on licence ('pub') until it was closed in late 2009 by the premises licence holder. A copy of this current premises licence is attached at Appendix B - Page 51. The applicant intends to surrender this licence if this current application is granted.

As per the application (under general description) the premises will be used as a convenience store and off licence. At the time this report was written, the premises were still closed.

3. AUTHORISATIONS AND TIMES APPLIED FOR

- Sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises
 - Monday to Sunday 08.00 to 02.00
- Hours premises are open to the public
 - Monday to Sunday 24 Hours

4. APPLICATION

- Please refer to the application attached at Appendix C Page 63 The original application was received on the 27th January 2010 but was rejected by the Licensing Authority due to the newspaper advertisement for the application being incorrect. The application was re-submitted on the 12th February 2010 with a slight change to the name of the premises, from 'Silam' to 'Sila'.
- Representations have been received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary as a
 responsible authority and also a local resident in the capacity of an interested party. A
 plan indicating the location of this interested party in relation to the premises is attached
 at Appendix D Page 85.
- Part P of the application sets out the applicant's proposed conditions under the licensing objectives The Prevention of Public Nuisance, Public Safety, Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protecting Children from Harm. - No representations have been received from any of the subsequent Responsible Authorities i.e. Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, Peterborough City Council Planning Department, Peterborough City Council Health & Safety Department, Peterborough City Council Children's Services, Peterborough City Council Environmental Pollution Team and Peterborough City Council Trading Standards Department.

An authorised person will be available at all times on the premises to show CCTV images immediately or to an authorised officer on demand.

CCTV images will be clear and comprehensible/

If any patrons are witnessed consuming alcohol outside the store they will beasked to move on by staff.

7.2 Prevention of Public Nuisance

Litter shall be prevented at all times and where identified regularly cleared from the vicinity of the premises.

Receptacles for refuse storage shall be maintained in a clean condition.

7.3 Public Safety

A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorised officer.

Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the schedule shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer on request..

7.4 Protection of Children from Harm

The 'Challenge 21' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises.

Signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premise operates the 'Challenge 21' initiative.

A log book of all refused alcohol sales will be kept and produced to an authorised officer on request.

All staff will be able to verbally challenge any persons attempting to buy alcohol or age restricted products who they believe to be under 21 years of age.

- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- · An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).





- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.


ON LICENCE NO CHILDRENS CERTIFICATE

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. 

Darren explained that the meeting was being held to attempt to resolve the outstanding issues raised by the Police in relation to the application for a premises licence at 50 Eastfield Road.

It was agreed by all at the meeting that the issue that is currently unresolved is the time that the sale of alcohol must cease. PC Maddox explained that the Police stood by their representation as it was presented to the licensing authority and they were still looking for the application to be rejected outright if the applicants continued with the timings initially applied for. PC Maddox did indicated that the representation would be withdrawn if the applicant curtailed the terminal hour for selling alcohol to 11pm.

Mr Bakir stated that he was not prepared to curtail the hours for selling hours to 11pm as he wished to be able to trade the same hours as other off licences in the nearby vicinity, ie Eastfield News, Jim Crown & News N Booze. PC Maddox stated that it was the intention of the Police to examine each of the licences mentioned with the intention of curtailing those licences that did not meet the Police's expectations regarding preventing anti social behaviour, etc. PC Maddox stated that News N Booze's licence was already in review and they had asked for it's licence to be curtailed until 11pm.

Mr Bakir stated that he would not curtail the hours applied for. Darren indicated that due to no compromise agreement being met the application would now be determined by the Licensing Act 2003 Sub – Committee.

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
