1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for a review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, taking into account the representation made by Pollution Control and Planning in their capacities as a Responsible Authorities, and representations from two interested parties. The review was bought under the Prevention of Public Nuisance objective.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 On the 4 August 2005 a conversion application was submitted by Mr Ibrahim Hassan to convert a justices restaurant licence to a premises licence, at that time the premises was called Meze Meze, and was a ground floor restaurant only. As no objections were received from the police, the licence was granted on 9 September 2005.

2.2 On the 12 February 2008 an application to transfer the premises licence to Mr Darr was received. As no representations were received the application was granted on the 29 February 2008. At this time the premises was called Al-Aziz.

2.3 On the 15 February 2008 an application to vary the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) to Mr Darr was received. As no representations were received the application was granted on the 3 March 2008.

2.4 On the 25 March 2010 an application to transfer the premises licence to Mr Aidas Meckauskas with immediate effect was received. As no representations were received, the application was granted.

2.5 On the 26 March 2010 an application to vary the DPS to Mr Aidas Meckauskas with immediate effect was received. As no representations were received the application was granted.

- 2.6 On the 21 September 2010 an application for a variation of the premises licence was received. This was withdrawn by the applicant's representative.
- 2.7 On 2 November 2010 an application for a variation of the premises licence was received. Representations were received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary and Pollution Control as Responsible Authorities, and three interested parties. The objections had regard to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and prevention of public nuisance objectives. A committee hearing to determine the application took place on 15 December 2010 and the application was granted with reduced hours to those applied for and extra conditions to the operating schedule.
- 2.8 On 17 November 2010 Mr Meckauskas applied for several Temporary Event Notices (TEN's), a table of the dates, timings and licensable activities of these TEN's is attached at **Appendix B – Page 9**
- 2.9 On 23 March 2011 a minor variation application was received to update the ground floor plan to reflect the current layout of the premises. As no objections were received the application was granted 14 April 2011. A copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix C – Page 11**

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Pollution Control, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.
- 3.2 A copy of the application to review was received 4 May 2011, this application was revised (for clarification purposes) a copy of this revised application was served on the licence holder and is attached at **Appendix D – Page 23**
- 3.3 A copy of the 'Notice' that was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no. 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 – The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 is attached at **Appendix E – Page 31**
- 3.4 A representation was received from Planning as a Responsible Authority, a copy of this representation is attached at **Appendix F – Page 33**
- 3.5 No other representations have been received from any of the remaining Responsible Authorities.
- 3.6 Representations have been received from two interested parties, one as a resident in the vicinity and one from a business operating in the vicinity. These representations are attached at **Appendix G – Page 35**
- 3.7 A statement (rebuttal) from the licence holder refuting the basis of the review was received on the 31 May 2011 with a petition in support of the premises licence containing 772 signatures. The statement is attached at **Appendix H – Page 39**
- 3.8 A copy of the petition is attached at **Appendix I – Page 47**

4.1 Summary of issues raised by Responsible Authorities

- i) Investigations have provided evidence that a statutory nuisance exists and has the likelihood to reoccur.
- ii) Noise complaints continue to be received
- iv) Requests made by Police to reduce the noise was not complied with
- v) Allegation of breaches of premises licence conditions and unauthorised licensable activities taking place at the premises.
- vi) Prohibitive use of the first floor by Planning legislation

5.1 Summary of issues raised by Interested parties

- i) Noise from premises causing a sleep deprivation and disturbance
- ii) Noise issues from loud music and noisy patrons
- iii) Anti social behaviour from patrons (shouting, singing etc)
- iv) Potential of property unable to be rented due to noise issues from premises

6. STATEMENT AND PETITION IN SUPPORT OF THE PREMISES LICENCE.

- 6.1 A petition from the patrons of the premises containing 772 signatures in support of the premises licence has been received. Some signatories are within the vicinity and some are from further afield e.g. Spalding, London, Luton, Basildon, Kings Lynn. Therefore, it is up to the committee to decide upon what 'weight' they attach to this petition. This is attached at **Appendix I – Page 47**
- 6.2 A statement from the Licence holder (who is also the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS)) has been received, refuting the allegations within the review. This is attached at **Appendix H – Page 39**

7 LICENSING OFFICERS COMMENTS

- 7.1 When a premises operates under a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) authorisation, the conditions of the premises licence do not take effect. However, a TEN does not remove the premises users obligations under any other legislation including that of a statutory nuisance.
- 7.2 Entertainment at a 'private event' to which the public are not admitted is not a licensable activity unless it is provided for consideration and with a view to profit. Also, consumption of alcohol is not a licensable activity. Therefore the provision of alcohol completely free of charge is not a licensable activity.
- 7.3 The licensing department received a phone call from Mr Meckauskas on the 24 March 2011, advising that he was having a live music event on the 25 March 2011, this notification is required by condition 26 of the premises licence. However the event on the 25 March is declared as a 'private event' in the statement provided by Mr Meckauskas. If this was the case, notification was not required as the premises licence authorisation was not being utilised.

9. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 9.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Pollution Control (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 9.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 4 May 2011.
- 9.3 The application before this committee will consider –
- (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 9.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are –
- (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
 - (e) to revoke the licence
- and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added

9.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

‘The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be issued in writing to the holder of the licence. But, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvements – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

‘Child’

(a) means an individual aged under 16

(b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

‘Designated Premises Supervisor’ means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

‘Interested parties’:

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association
- a member of the relevant licensing authority.

‘Late Night Refreshment’ means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

‘Licensable Activities’ means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

‘Licensing Authority’: - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

‘Licensed Premises’ includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

‘Licensing Objectives’

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

‘Operating Schedule’ means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises

- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

‘Rateable Value’: as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

‘Regulated Entertainment’ (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

Or the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

‘Relevant Licensing Authority’: is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

‘Responsible Authority’ means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health – Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children’s Services – Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

‘Supply of alcohol’:

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

‘Temporary Event Notice’ means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration – they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale – they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises – the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and

- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time – a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

‘the Act’: means the Licensing Act 2003

‘Vicinity’: Given the normal everyday meaning of being ‘near to’ when considering the relevance of representations received from individual’s residence or business.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when
 - (a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

Provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

The outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

The likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark
7. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Door Supervision (where supervisors are engaged this condition applies)

8. All door supervisors will be Security Industry Authority registered.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

All Licensing Objectives

Crime and Disorder

9. CCTV cameras situated both inside and outside the premises, one on each floor and one at the front and back doors

Public Safety

10. All staff will be fully trained with regards to health and safety and fire regulations

Public Nuisance

11. Live music will only be performed on the ground floor of the premises
12. The premises licence holder will ensure that Recorded Music is played through speakers that are situated at the furthest possible distance from residential accommodation on the first floor
13. The premises licence holder will ensure that the volume of any recorded music will be decreased after midnight
14. Any requests from an Authorised Officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels shall be complied with
15. When live music takes place there will be a maximum of four performers
16. The Licence Holder/DPS will ensure that customers arrive and depart the premises in a manner which will not cause annoyance to nearby residents

Protection of Children from Harm

17. All staff will be fully trained with regards to the sale of alcohol and the prevention of underage sales

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Crime and Disorder

18. CCTV systems to record all areas where a licensable activity takes place
19. CCTV images to be kept for one month and made available for inspection upon request by an authorising officer of the City Council, Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer
20. CCTV to be placed in a suitable position by all exits and entrances to record all persons visiting and leaving the premises during the hours of licensable activity
21. CCTV recorded images must be of a suitable quality for evidential purpose

Public Nuisance

22. The Premises Licence Holder or the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that noise does not emanate from the premises so as to not cause a nuisance.
23. During the playing of music, all external doors and windows to remain closed other than for access and egress, so as to prevent a noise nuisance emanating from the premises
24. Any request from an authorised Officer of the Council, Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer to reduce music to an acceptable level so as not to cause a noise nuisance shall be complied with
25. Notices to be displayed in a prominent position by all exits requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly so as not to cause a noise nuisance in the immediate vicinity to neighbours
26. Live Music: Six occasions per annum, the Licensing Team must be informed of the event 24 hours in advance and the events must only take place on Fridays and Saturdays

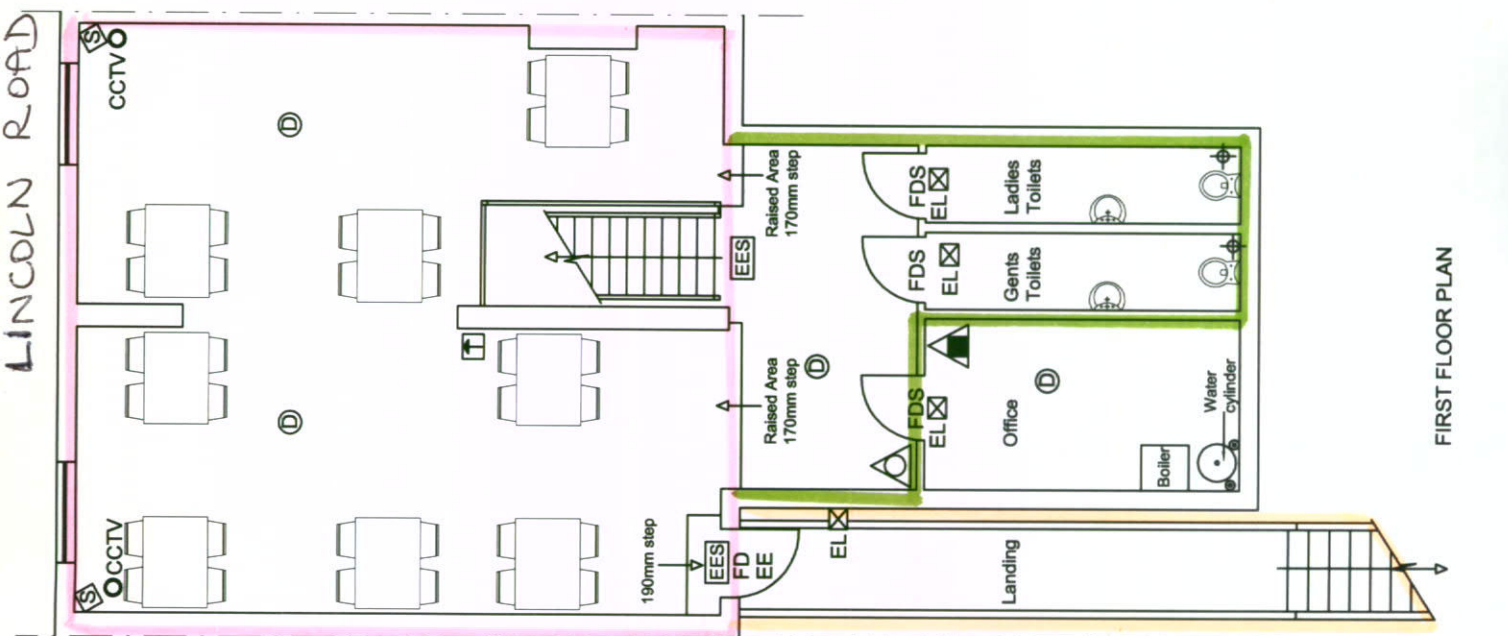

The Pollution Control team are requesting a review of the premises licence for Kaimas Lithuanian Restaurant under the Prevention of public nuisance objective.

The Pollution Control Team have been investigating the premise under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 for allegations that a noise nuisance exists at a residential property on Lincoln Road, Peterborough.

The investigation has provided evidence that a noise problem exists and has the likelihood to reoccur. This conclusion has been established through the collection of evidence from sound monitoring equipment, witness statements and direct observations by officers of the Pollution Control Team.

The premises licence holder was informed about complaints in April 2010 and on other occasions. After witnessing the noise from the restaurant on the 10th December 2010 a statutory noise abatement notice was served on the 13th December 2010 on the licence holder requesting him to abate the nuisance and forbid reoccurrence.

Since 13th of December 2010 the numerous noise incidents have been reported and recorded a chronological list is available in Appendix 1.

On 22nd December 2010 Police Officer Petr Torak visited the restaurant following complaints from residents and requested the restaurant staff to decrease the volume of the music. The request was not complied with.

The Police Officer Petr Torak also witnessed on 22nd December 2010 that people were dancing in the restaurant. This activity is not authorised by the premises licence.

Patrons dancing and singing along with the music caused additional noise nuisance and vibration which can be clearly heard within nearby residential premises.

Noise complaints continued to be received and recordings have been obtained to confirm breaches of the noise abatement notice, live music being played after authorised hours and the premises being open outside authorised hours, in excess of the premises licence authorisation.

On 25th March 2011 Officer Petr Torak visited the restaurant following complaints from residents and requested the restaurant staff to decrease the volume of the music. The request was not complied with. It was witnessed by PC Petr Torak that the first floor was being used for food and the serving of drinks. For information, the first floor has no valid planning permission therefore not allowed to be used until valid planning permission is granted and the conditions applied by building control complied with.

The opinion of Pollution Control Team is that the building is inappropriately located and designed for the type of the activities that are undertaken in the restaurant.

I therefore suggest that due to the continuing complaints and monitoring evidence undertaken, that Kaimas is in breach of conditions 13, 22 and 24 of the current licence as well as operating outside the authorisation. It is also worth noting that conditions 22 and 24 were conditions attached to the licence by the committee after a hearing.

13. Public Nuisance

The premises licence holder will ensure that the volume of any recorded music will be decreased after midnight

22. Public Nuisance

The Premises Licence Holder or the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that noise does not emanate from the premises so as to not cause a nuisance.

24. Public Nuisance

Any request from an authorised Officer of the Council, Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer to reduce music to an acceptable level so as not to cause a noise nuisance shall be complied with

Due to continued breach of the noise abatement notice and non-compliance of licence conditions it is therefore recommended that, since activities can not be controlled through the use of conditions that live and recorded music is removed from the licence and opening hours are restricted.

Recommendations

- 1. To remove live and recorded music from the licence
- 2. To reduce opening hours on Sunday to Thursday from 12:00hrs to 23:00hrs
- 3. To reduce opening hours on Friday and Saturday from 12:00hrs to 23:30hrs
- 4. To remove the use of the first floor as part of the licensed area. There is no valid planning permission for use of this floor plus Building Regulations require sound insulation of the first floor party wall with 565 Lincoln Rd before this floor can be used.

Further to the proposed review of the **premises licence (Ref No 061205)** regarding the **Kaimas Lithuanian Restaurant at 561 - 563 Lincoln Road, Peterborough, PE1 2PB**, the Local Planning Authority wishes to object to the use of the upper floor as part of the existing restaurant.

The planning permission to use the ground floor of the above premises as a restaurant was granted on 10.05.2001 under reference 01/00225/FUL. The planning decision notice includes at condition 5 the following text:

The restaurant and hot food takeaway use hereby permitted shall be limited to the ground floor of the premises (Nos. 561 and 563 Lincoln Road) only.

The condition specifically prevents the use of the first floor as a restaurant because it would have a significant detrimental impact on the adjacent terraced properties that were and can be used for residential purposes. The impact of noise and vibration from the restaurant use on the upper floor, which could be directly adjacent to possible bedrooms in the neighbouring residential uses, could not be readily addressed by the provision of sound proofing or other enforceable planning conditions.

Furthermore, The Local Planning Authority received a planning compliance complaint on 27.01.2011 that the upper floor of the above premises is being used as a restaurant.

The use of the upper floor as a restaurant was established by site visit on 01.02.2011. A letter dated 08.02.2011 was sent to the owner and the restaurant operator advising that the use of the upper floor as a restaurant was unauthorised and that it should cease as soon as possible and specifically not later than 8/3/11. The recipients chose not to end the use of the upper floor by the due date and this was confirmed by site visit on 08/03/2011.

As the existing use of the upper floor is in breach of the planning permission to use the ground floor as a restaurant, the Group Manager, Development Management within the planning Service has instructed that a planning enforcement notice should be served for breach of the above planning condition. The purpose of the notice would be to put a stop the unauthorised use of the upper floor as a restaurant. The service of the enforcement notice has been held in abeyance pending one further letter of warning to the interested parties (Owner, operator and any mortgage providers) and the out come of this licence review.

The Local Planning Authority is also aware that the restaurant activity on the ground floor is likely to have an impact on the residential amenity of the adjacent dwellings. It

would support the suggested revisions to the licence, as they would minimise the impact of the ground restaurant use on the neighbouring properties.

It is respectfully requested that when considering the review of the licence for the above premises, the licensing panel takes into account the views of the Local Planning Authority that the continued use of the upper floor of the above premises as a restaurant is unacceptable.

I wish to make a representation for the review of the premises licence for Kaimas restaurant on Lincoln Road, Peterborough, we are the owners of the property 565/565A Lincoln Road which is attached to Kaimas Restaurant.

We have tenants living above the Scizzoroom which is 565A but unfortunately since Kaimas has opened they have had nothing but trouble with the noise pollution from the restaurant on a Friday and Saturday evening. When we rented our flat to our tenants we told them how nice and quiet the flat was, we were not telling an untruth, we have owned the property for several years and never experienced any noise pollution from the previous occupants of the property.

We have spent a lot of money renovating the property to attract decent tenants, which we have found but due to the problems of very loud noise from the restaurant our tenants said they have had enough and want to move out.

How are we supposed to get anybody to live in a flat where they can't sleep on a Friday or Saturday evening until the noise stops very late into the night.

We have rang the council several times for our tenants as we feel terrible that they have to live like this. I know we wouldn't and I'm sure nobody would chose to live like this.

The police have been called numerous times regarding the noise and agreed that it was in excess of the agreed level that is acceptable. The council have also monitored the noise levels and found them to be above acceptable levels. How many times do people have to break the law before something is done about it?

If this problem is not sorted out and our tenants move out would the owners of the restaurant or the council want to pay the rent for the flat every month because nobody else will. If we don't get the rent paid we can't pay our business rates vicious circle isn't it!

I hope that the correct action is taken against the Kaimas Restaurant and that life can get back to normal for our tenants which they deserve as being hard working couple that just need sleep!

Representation for the review of a permits licence for Kaimas restaurant

I wish to make a representation as a response to an application for a licence review for Kaimas restaurant on Lincoln Road. Due to the problems I am currently experiencing, I feel that the extended hours they have applied for would have a serious detrimental effect on my home life. I also feel that since regulated entertainment has been allowed on the first floor it exacerbated the problem I have with noise from music and patrons of the premises.

Me and my boyfriend have moved to 565A Lincoln Road before Lithuanian restaurant Kaimas was opened. From beginning we had problems with closing time, it closed very late at 1 or 2 o'clock. All the time was very noisy and high sounding and the problem started.

We have to wake up early morning to work so if music is until 2am and we wake up at 4am we sleep only 2 hours what it is not enough for adults. Sometimes after closing time some drunk guys stay next the restaurant they sing, swear and fight. They damage stuff around, kicking waste bins... and so on. We hear everything from restaurant and feel like we sleep in the centre of their party. We are scared of their aggressive behaviour. Our front door is beside the entrance of the restaurant so they can easily kick out the door and enter into our flat! The other thing is they piss, spit and vomit around all restaurant what is terribly disgusting.

The disco starts usually around 7pm (on summer it was around 10pm) – it's always very loud. A few times we called a police. They arrived, for couple of minutes the party stopped, when the police left, everything started again.

From 29th April 2010 we complain to City Council and we are waiting for solve the problem. The owner of restaurant said nobody can stop him and his business. He smiles straight to our faces. They threat us, we don't feel safe in our own home. We are very tired of all situation.

In December 2010 Pollution Control served a Noise Abatement Notice on the restaurant. It did not stop the noise at all. Over the Christmas period we suffered noise nuisance on numerous times. My boyfriend almost lost his job as a result of tiredness from not sleeping during the night. He got a warning from his employer this time.

We have reported noise nuisance from the restaurant which happened since January 2011. Pollution Control Officers installed noise monitoring equipment in my house many times and I keep reporting the noisy incidents but nothing has been improved. Sometimes the music has been played in restaurant as long as 2am, after the music is finished there is always noise from people in the restaurant we can hear them talking and laughing. We are hoping the committee will reduce the hours when the

restaurant is open and remove music from the licence so we can have reasonable few hours of sleep during the night.

Also I believe the first floor is not appropriate to have a restaurant there and we do not understand how Council can allow this Restaurant to be open on the first floor next to residential property. This is not a quiet family restaurant which would only serve food to customers, we feel that this is more like a club or a pub with people singing, shouting and dancing.

Application for the review of a premises licence at 561 – 563 Lincoln Road, Peterborough PE1 2PB

I would like to make the following points as to Ms. Wojszczyk application brought with view of preventing public nuisance.

It is claimed that there is excessive noise disturbance emanating from the premises. I refuse to accept this allegation as no person, apart from the residential occupier at first floor, 565 Lincoln Road, Peterborough ("the Residential Neighbour"), has ever raised complaint to me. Having said this I would like it to be noted that even the Residential Neighbour has never had the courtesy of addressing any of his complaints directly to me on any occasion. He has taken the extreme direct action of reporting me to the council and police without first trying to resolve the matter in a polite, friendly and courteous manner. I do not understand his direct and unfriendly actions and I do at times feel harassed and as if he is causing me a private nuisance which is risking my business. I feel this way as the Residential Neighbour seems to be the only neighbour who has a grudge against me. If there is any nuisance I am inadvertently and unknowingly causing it must be a private nuisance to the Residential Neighbour as opposed to a public nuisance to the community.

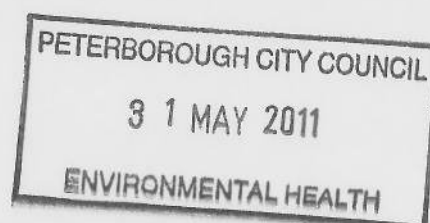
I purchased the leasehold property in early 2010 and I believe that since my occupation, I have built good rapport and friendly relations with all my neighbours expecting the Residential Neighbour. Many of the neighbours attend my restaurant for after work meals/drinks and they often comment on the friendly, soft and home-some environment and even on the occasion of 25 March 2011, when I celebrated the first year anniversary of my restaurant, I had many neighbours visiting with presents and kind words of congratulations. I invite any person from the council or neighbourhood to visit my restaurant to experience how soft and calm the atmosphere is.

With respect to the points made by Ms. Wojszczyk I would like to comment as follows;

Application brought to meet licencing objective to prevent public nuisance

It is my argument that I have not caused a public nuisance. I would like the Ms. Wojszczyk to show how my use of the property and the running of my business has caused a nuisance to the community, the businesses located near me and also to the wider community in the central ward. If at most it were shown I have caused nuisance to the Residential Neighbour I would argue this is a private nuisance and not a public nuisance. I will no doubt be willing to work with any person I have caused private nuisance to best resolve this matter in a reasonable manner. But I would at this stage point out I do not consider to have ever acted unreasonably in my use of the property.

My business, a family restaurant, is the only restaurant in Peterborough to provide a friendly, soft and light environment for European families to relax and dine. It is located in an area where most of the European community have settled and my restaurant is decorated to a very high standard. Bearing in mind that it is a family restaurant, music levels are kept at a low level for the provision of a relaxing ambience and background atmosphere. Rarely, if ever, is music raised to

a level higher than audible conversation level as this would clearly not work in a restaurant and would not make business sense.

My restaurant is not exclusive to the European community and many locals including local business employees come for lunch and after work meals to my restaurant. I enclose references from a few local businesses, some of which are located next door or two doors away from me, and one where the business owners actually live two doors away from me in the front part of the building, where if there was any noise or public nuisance they would be amongst the first to note it. If my business was causing a problem I am sure that these people would not come to my restaurant neither promote it or speak to me in such a complimentary manner. I also attach a petition of support from many local residents.

Nevertheless, public nuisance is not something I have overlooked and not something I do not care about. Within my restaurant, as well as on the front and rear, I have installed CCTV cameras, so should something happen I will be able to assist the police. However I would like it to be noted never has anything violent or disruptive happened as my customer base is very good and respect the local area. Further, on the very few times I have held events in excess of 20 people (where TEN notices were required and where they were not) I have always employed the use of licenced door supervisors. Whilst this was not necessarily required, given I know my customers are good family people, I still did this as I am ever courteous to not distress others and understand that at times people can get drunk and become irresponsible, even though I do not recall this ever happening on my premises.

I do not recall ever causing any policing issue as a result of the running of my business or any client's leaving my property. The only times the police have visited my property is to do with noise complaints (which I argue are not a public nuisance). Even though in the application by Ms. Wojszczyk it is noted that on two occasions the request to reduce the volume of the music was not followed I do not recall these two occasions and would require further evidence so I can investigate this myself if the accounts are true. Clearly, for any of my employees not to be aiding and assisting the police is not good.

Taking the above into consideration along with the facts that there have been no reports or representations that;

- public disturbance has been caused by customers arriving at or leaving the premises and resorting/ remaining in the vicinity of the premises;
- public disturbance has been caused by customers queuing or by any associated congestion either by pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

I do not believe I, or the running of my business, causes a public nuisance and I genuinely believe at all times I am promoting and assisting in preventing public nuisance.

Location of the property

The property when originally applying for a variation in the premises licence in 2010 was not refused nor resisted. Further it is not located within a sensitive area save as to the existence of the church, however I am not aware of any complaint ever arising from the church and if they ever did have a complaint I would be more than willing to resolve it with them in a reasonable manner.

The garden area and front open area's are not used for the purposes of business and their use has never been accused of creating a public nuisance. It is only the internal closed property, which is accused of creating a public nuisance.

Ms. Wojszczyk in her application has advised that the opinion of the Pollution Team is that the building is inappropriately located and designed. However, as for it's design, I would invite all council members to the property to note how it has been decorated and fitted to a very high quality with wooden (which assist in sound control) walls and flooring. Further, as for it's location, I would like the council to note the existence of the many restaurant/fast food takeaway's (with and without sale of alcohol) and the public house situated very close to my property. Some of these property's (the public house and Zorba takeaway) sell alcohol and are able to do so for extended hours. I cannot understand how it is only my property that can be suggested to be in the wrong location when the public house and other restaurant's and fast food takeaways (some of which are open till very late) have run and operated in this area for many years. Further my property has passed hands 4 times in the last four years, on each occasion being a restaurant/fast food takeaway, so it cannot be argued that the location of the property is wrong when the historical use of the property and also the area has been commercial and food related.

Further, from the enclosed references, you will note that my family restaurant has been welcomed in the area and as I have already submitted is in fact in an ideal location where many European people live.

It does not cause a problem to the wider public, such as passer-bys and people visiting nearby properties/business. I would in fact argue, as I am sure many of my neighbours would agree, that there is more noise caused by the individuals from the public who use and have so for many years as almost tradition used, the parking strip outside my property and neighbouring properties. This parking strip is frequently at night occupied by street crawlers and people (unrelated to me or my customers) who are coming out of the pub or merely parking up as a social event. They play music and rev their car engines which is much more noticeable then any noise emanating from my business. This can be confirmed via references from the neighbours, including the proprietors of MinuteMan who are 2 doors away from me and also live on the first floor, front part of the property.

The existence of noise nuisance and evidence thereto

Ms. Wojszczyk has provided in Appendix 1 12 occasions when noise related incidents have been noted at my business. I would argue that the reports are unfair. Even though there have been only 12 occasions in the last 6 months I still consider these allegations very serious and wish to provide response to these;

I am limited to how I can control loud customers but in the majority of cases my customers are not loud and respect the restaurant atmosphere let alone the community.</p> <p>I cannot comment as to what is considered as loud customers and music and would ask to be provided the recordings and confirmation on how they have reached the level of "loud".</p> <p>Further, if there was "loud noise" I would like it to be noted that this was a Friday night, and also a Friday night prior to the Christmas holiday where most people would now have received time off work until the new year or been in merry state looking forward to the following week. Naturally in this seasonal time spirits are high and whilst I am not saying that this provides a defence IF there was loud customers I would like the council to understand the intensified spirit of the customers.</p>
18/12/10	<p>As above for 17/12/10.</p> <p>With respect to the vibrations I do not understand this allegation but note that this is the only time it has been noted in appendix 1.</p>
22/12/10	<p>As above for 17/12/10 but now bearing in mind that this is a day when most people would now have got time off work for the seasonal break. This would also make sense given I had many bookings for company christmas meals and it is noted that this "noise" occurred prior to 22:00 when a Christmas meal was more than likely taking place.</p> <p>Further most Europeans celebrate Christmas on the orthodox day of 24th December 2011 so I would ask the council to understand that spirits would have been exceptionally high this day IF the council to believe that that there were loud customers.</p> <p>The allegation further provides that a police officer visited following complaints and asked for music levels to be reduced. It is denied I did not comply with his order as I always act and ask my client's to act in a manner to support the police.</p>
25/12/10	<p>The allegation is that during the day there was live music. During this period I had applied for a TEN (060373) and was permitted to play live music. 29/01/11	<p>As above for 28/01/11.</p> <p>Further I am confused how the noise carried on till 04:00. During this time it could only have been staff in the property and not customers.</p>
11/02/11	<p>As above for 28/01/11 and it is noted that this allegation was recorded prior to 22:00.</p>
03/03/11	<p>As above for 28/01/11.</p>
25/03/11	<p>The allegation is that there was live music and customers were loud. I would confirm this day to be the first year anniversary of the restaurant which was celebrated from 20:00 till late. I was joined by 20-30 of my friends and family and we celebrated the first year of my business.</p> <p>This is the one and only occasion when I have not had a TEN for a "event" at my restaurant. I had unfortunately applied outside of the time limited for this event and was advised by my solicitor and Simon Andrews of the licencing department that I would not be able to run my event to the public, however if I was to close the business, close the tills and run a private party (as I did) given the property was being used as a private purpose and not for business I would not be breaching the premises licence.</p> <p>This is what I did and that is why there was live music at the property. As for the loud music I do not believe this to be true but naturally in celebration I hope the council can understand why voices may have got loud (if they did).</p> <p>Further this was a one off event (anniversary event) and the first time I had failed to obtain a TEN. Accordingly noting that I could not open the business to the public I closed it and made the use of it on this day private. I recall a police offer visiting on this day and I recall showing him the letter from my solicitor and working with him.</p>

09/04/11	<p>As above for 28/01/11. I have no explanation to the noise similar to TV. No speakers are near windows or doors.</p>

I would also like to add to the above that if the council do believe there is a "noise" problem then it must be noted that nearly all the events took place on a weekend when families/friends are out. Accordingly, it is not the case that this happens on a frequent basis every night of the week but is something limited to when the restaurant is open later on Friday and Saturday nights. I do do my best and advise my employees to speak to any customers who are loud but this is

something that rarely required and is more over done so as not to disturb the friendly and soft family restaurant atmosphere. If I am showing such constraints to my own customers for my own purposes I struggle to understand how such constraints do not automatically benefit noise reduction for anyone outside of my property walls.

Breach of current premises licence

Firstly I would respectfully ask for someone at the council to confirm what exactly is my current licence covering? I am advised by the licencing team I have a licence for the first floor for provision of hot food and alcohol and then I am advised by the pollution team I do not. I would like it to be noted that I have lost in excess of £4000.00 in legal costs for representation to be made to obtain this licence. Following a meeting, where I was represented by Belinda Smith & Co Solicitors I was advised that I have a licence for the whole building and I am confused why one part of the council advise me I do have a licence and then another say I don't.

Regardless, on each occasion where activities outside of the premises licence have been required I have made a TEN application. This shows my willingness and ability to follow and comply with council regulations and requirements. There is only one time I did not apply for a TEN and that was on 25 March 2011 which has been explained above.

Further I would like the following to be noted about my use of the property and allegedly being in breach of my premises licence;

- I have only applied for 4 TEN's in my 15 months of occupying this property. I have ability to hold more TEN's but have never needed to. This shows I know how to apply for TEN's but even then do not use my property on a frequent basis to hold such events. I hope this supports the fact that I do not cause public nuisance.
- In addition to the above it must be remembered that this has been effectively my first year of business. It is a time where I should be promoting my business and holding as many events as possible to promote my business and raise it's awareness. However again I would like the council to note that this is not the kind of business I have run where I have done this and not cared for neighbours. I have intentionally not used all my TEN's nor done anything over-extravagant (except for the first year anniversary and Christmas period).
- Whilst the council have had complaints about me, and one only being made whilst a TEN was in operation (25/12/10) it is wonder that the council never received complaint for my other 3 TEN's which occurred over a period of 5 days. Surely the council will understand that if the public nuisance created by my property were ever to be noted it would be on dates I have specifically advised the council and the public I would be making excessive noise?! However it is astonishing to note that this is not the case. I hope through this the council will understand what has been considered to be "loud" or "noisy" or "public nuisance" is very inconsistent and unfair.

The promotion of small businesses and ability to employ

If the council believe that I am not doing enough to run my business in a reasonable manner then the only alternative that seems logical to me is to close down my business which will be financially disastrous to me and the 12 people I employ for it's running. I also strongly feel that this would be disastrous to the local area and the European community are limited for choice and I would argue have no other (family restaurant) outlet in Peterborough. Even the reduction of the current licence will cause me a problem as my business relies on a big booking (part of 20-40) at least once a month. Usually such bookings like to relax, chat and wine and dine past the midnight mark, especially if celebrating a birthday or anniversary. I usually only trade up till 23.30 but on Friday's and Saturday's and special events I usually stay open till 01.00. If I am no longer able to open for this long I strongly feel my customer base will substantially decline as there will be no desire to go to a restaurant that has a early closing time.

Further, if per Ms. Wojszczyk opinion music is not allowed at the property you will be destroying my business. As for live music, this is always applied for via TEN notice, never has a live music event taken place without TEN. As for recorded music, it is absurd in asking me not to have it during operating hours. Recorded music is essential to my business as a family restaurant. Accordingly, you would be destroying a new business which is many have expressed as important for the local community and which has received many positive reviews. Lastly, opening hours do not need to be restricted as they are rarely used to full extent and only on Friday and Saturdays is the restaurant opened past midnight.

I strongly feel, as do many of my customers, local business owners and residents, that I am supporting and benefiting the community with my friendly family restaurant. I am providing a positive contribution to Peterborough and it is unfair and unreasonable to suggest the operation of my business causes a nuisance.
