1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for the review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 served by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in relation to the above premises. The review was bought under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 A conversion application through 'Grandfather rights' of a Justice's Off Licence was made by Mr & Mrs Wahiwala and the Premises Licence was granted in July 2005. The licence was transferred on a number of occasions before in November 2011 the premises licence was transferred to the current licence holder, Mr Rashad Mahmood with the current designated premises supervisor being Ms Nicola Coulson.
- 2.2 A copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix B Page 9**.

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Cambridgeshire Constabulary, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.
- 3.2 Copies of the application to review was received on 18 August 2017. The first copy was the full review document which was served at the premises on 18 September 2017. This

document contains sensitive information of an ongoing Police investigation so a second sanitised review document was also served for public viewing. The committee have access to both the full and sanitised review documents. The sanitised review document is attached at **Appendix C – Page 21.**

- 3.3 A statutory 'Notice' was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no. 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005.
- 3.4 No representations have been received from any of the remaining Responsible Authorities nor from other persons.

4. SUMMARY OF ISSUES RAISED BY CAMBRIDGESHIRE CONSTABULARY

A serious violent incident took place outside the premises which involved the
premises licence holder.
A failure by the premises licence holder to assist Police by refusing to supply CCTV
footage of the violent incident previously mentioned.
Criminality believed to be taking place at the premises

6. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 6.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Trading Standards (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 18 August 2017.
- 6.3 The application before this committee will consider
 - (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 6.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence

- (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
- (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

6.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

'The licensing authority may decide that the review does not require it to take any further steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such informal warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be in issued in writing to the licence holder. However, where responsible authorities such as the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this into account when considering what further action is appropriate.'

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public

- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Challenge 25' means that a retailer will ask for proof of identification if they have reason to believe that the person making a purchase of alcohol is under the age of 25.

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Lice Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013.

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority. Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days);
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

	This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:
1.	No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when
	(a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
	(b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2.	Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3.	The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
	(The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark



Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule			
Protection of Children from Harm			
1.	Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink under the authority of a personal licence holder must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to suspect that the individual may be under 18 years of age.		

Annex 2A - Embedded Restrictions

Embedded Restrictions:

Licensees should note that the under enclosed embedded restrictions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours




On Good Friday, 8 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered:
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises

'Priory Road Store', 44 Priory Road, Peterborough, PE1 9ED is an off license / convenience store operating under a premises license (PL No: 062411) issued by Peterborough City Council (PCC). The premises license holder is Mr. Rashad Mahmood of 210 Cromwell Road, Peterborough, PE1 2HG.

The premises license allows for the sale of alcohol between 08:00hrs and 23:00hrs Monday to Saturday and 10:00hrs and 22:30hrs on a Sunday, and has no realistic conditions attached that would help uphold the licensing objectives.

On Sunday 09th July 2017 at about 19:00pm a serious violent incident occurred in the park off Nicholls Road at the rear of, and a short walk from Priory Road Store.

At 20:30pm on the same day a serious violent disorder took place immediately outside Priory Road Store involving a large number of males. The Police believe this was a reprisal for the previous incident.

The Premises License Holder did not allow the Police to view the shop CCTV.

Police Officers attended Priory Road Store and seized the CCTV hard drive and other items.

It is the Constabulary's opinion that the Licensing objective to preventing crime and disorder is not being upheld by the license holder.

Cambridgeshire Constabulary recommend the Premises License is revoked with immediate effect.
