1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine this application for a <u>new</u> premises licence for Temptation Taste of Portugal Limited, 309 Lincoln Road, Peterborough, PE1 2PH taking into account the background information and representations received from a responsible authority and two 'other persons' in opposition of the application.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On 6th February 2006 an application was made by Mr Serin for a new premises licence for Bingol Kebab and Pizza at 309 Lincoln Road, Peterborough. This application, for late night refreshment only, was granted in March 2006.
- 2.2 On 31st January 2007 an application to vary the premises licence to include the 'off sales' of alcohol was made by Mr Serin. This was granted in March 2007 with the permitted hours being: Monday Noon to 3am, Tuesday Noon to 2am, Wednesday and Thursday Noon to 3am, Friday and Saturday Noon until 4am, Sunday Noon until 2am.
- 2.3 After a premises licence holder change in March 2014 on 6th January 2016 the premises licence was revoked due to the licence holders, Euro Fried Chicken and Pizza Limited being liquidated as a company at Companies House.
- 2.4 The current applicant does not have any known link to the previous premises licence holders.
- 2.5 Since 18th April 2013 the Licensing Authority has adopted a special policy relating to the cumulative impact in respect to all licensed premises within the 'Operation Can Do' area. An explanation of what this special policy entails can be found on page 10 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. A map showing the Can Do area is attached at **Appendix C Page 39.**
- 2.6 The premises falls within the 'Operation Can Do' area and is therefore subject to the provisions of the special 'cumulative impact' policy.

On the morning that Greenwich Mean Time changes to British Summertime one hour will be added to the terminal hour of any activities and to the closing time for the premises where the existing terminal hour for the activities and/or closing hour for the premises ends after 1am.

4. APPLICATION

- 4.1 Please refer to the application attached at **Appendix B Pages 11 37**. The applicant is being represented by their agent, Mr Andrew Heeler of Hegartys LLP.
- 4.2 Representations against the application have been received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary in their capacity as a 'Responsible Authority'. There have also been two further representations made against the application. The first is from the Millfield and New England Regeneration Partnership (MANERP) and the second from a local Councillor. These are attached at **Appendix D, E and F on Pages 41 50**.

- 4.3 Part P of the application sets out the applicant's proposed conditions under the licensing objectives, these being, 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance', 'Public Safety', 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and 'The Protection of Children from Harm'. These are also contained within the body of this report (in section 7) and in accordance with section 10.5 of Guidance have been interpreted into enforceable conditions. Only those appropriate and proportionate for the promotion of the licensing objectives have been included in the Operating Schedule.
- 4.4 No representations have been received from any other of the Responsible Authorities i.e. Peterborough Trading Standards, Public Health Authority, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council Planning Department, Peterborough City Council Health & Safety Department, Peterborough City Council Environmental Pollution Team, or Children's Services. There are no representations in support of the application.
- 4.5 A 'Notice' was displayed in the newspaper in accordance with Part 4 No. 25 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005.

5. REPRESENTATIONS

- 5.1 Summary of issues raised by authorities objecting to the application:
 - In 'Op Can-do' area which is now subject to a special 'cumulative impact policy.
 - 'Off Sales' of alcohol would lead to an increase in anti-social behaviour in the vicinity.
- 5.2 There were no representations in support of the application.

6. MEDIATION

6.1 Mediation has taken place with the applicant via his legal representative. However at the production of this report mediation has not been successful.

7. APPLICANT'S PROPOSED CONDITIONS UNDER THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

7.1 Crime and disorder

- The premises licence holder will ensure that a digital CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.informationcommissioner.gov.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
- CCTV images shall be retained for a minimum of 31 days and should be produced to a Police Officer (including PCSOs) or Local Authority Officer immediately upon demand..
- The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of a least 2 hours afterwards.
- The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders of every person entering or leaving the premises in all light conditions.
- At all times the premises are open for business a member of staff shall be present who is capable of operating the digital CCTV system and downloading images at the request of a Police Officer (include PCSO) or Local Authority Officer
- The CCTV system shall be capable of downloading images to a recognizable viewable format.
- All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only and shall not be consumed on the premises.

- Alcohol consumed outside the premises building shall only be consumed by patrons seated at tables.
- Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be supplied with, and ancillary to a substantial take-away meal.
- Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- There will be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
- A alcohol refusals register will be kept at the premises and kept an maintained by all staff. The register will contain the date and time of the potential sale, what product was refused and a brief description of the person and the name and signature of the person who refused the sale
- The premises licence holder / designated premises supervisor, or in their absence another responsible person, is to maintain an 'Incident report register' in a bound book, in which full details of all incidents are recorded. This shall be completed as soon as possible and in any case no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The register is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to a Police Officer (inc PCSO) or an authorized Licensing Authority Officer when required. The records should be retained for a minimum of 12 months
- Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises (eg to smoke) shall not be permitted to to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- As soon as possible, and in any event within 1 month from the grant of the licence, the premises shall join the local Nightsafe / Pubwatch scheme scheme including the local radio scheme.

7.2 Prevention of Public Nuisance

- All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 9pm except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
- All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- Prominent, clear and legible notices at all exits shall be displayed on the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly. Notices will also be prominently displayed in any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and to leave the area quietly.
- During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that the area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- No deliveries will be made to the premises between 11pm and 8am the following day.

7.3 **Protection of children from harm**

- The 'Challenge 25' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises and signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operates the 'Challenge 25' initiative
- All tills shall automatically prompt staff to ask for age verification identification when presented with an alcohol sale.

7.4 **Public Safety**

 A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorised officer.

9. LICENSING OFFICER'S COMMENT (FOR INFORMATION)

- 9.1 Regulation 19(a) requires authorities to disregard any information given by a party or person that is "not relevant" to the application.
- 9.2 Members should note that the letters and emails attached are in their entirety and that not all matters raised within the representations are relevant matters for consideration under the Licensing Act 2003. It is up to the Committee to decide upon what 'weight' they attach to these areas.

10. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a new licence made under Section 17 of the Licensing Act.
- 10.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 16 November 2017.
- 10.3 The application before this Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Licensing Committee will make its decision based upon:
 - The merits of the application:
 - The promotion of the four licensing objectives;
 - The statement of policy of the Licensing Authority; and
 - The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 – October 2014.
- 10.4 The licensing authority may determine the application, depending upon what is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in any of the following ways:
 - Decide to grant the licence in the same terms as it was applied for;

- Decide to grant the licence, but to modify or add conditions (to promote the licensing objectives);
- Exclude from the scope of the licence a licensable activity; and
- Decide to refuse to grant the licence.
- 10.5 Conditions are modified if they are altered, omitted or any new condition added (Section 35(4) Licensing Act 2003.

APPENDIX A LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Challenge 25' means that a retailer will ask for proof of identification if they have reason to believe that the person making a purchase of alcohol is under the age of 25.

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Live Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days);
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.

A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.

As soon as possible, and in any event within 1 month from the grant of this licence, the premises shall join the local Pubwatch or other local crime reduction scheme approved by the police, and local radio scheme if available.

MC65

No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00) and (08.00) on the following day.

MC68

All external emergency exit doors shall be fitted with sensor alarms and visible indicators to alert staff when the doors have been opened.

MC71

The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

MC72

The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.

MC73

The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in


accordance with the plans provided.

On 20th October 2017 Cambridgeshire Constabulary Licensing Department (Peterborough District) received e-mail notification from Peterborough City Council Licensing Authority of an application for a new Premises License at 309 Lincoln Road, Peterborough, PE1 2PH. The application has been submitted by legal representation from Hegarty LLP, Peterborough acting on behalf of the applicant. The applicant is Mr. Alfredo Correia who has an Alcohol Personal License reference 045947 issued by Peterborough City Council. Mr. Correia is the premises license holder and designated premises supervisor at the next door premises 'A Tasca', 311, Lincoln Road, Peterborough, PE1 2PH – the premises next door.

I understand that the applicant wishes to open a new venue and describes it as a restaurant called 'Temptation Taste of Portugal'. The applicant seek to install hours and conditions consistent with the 'Off & On' sale of alcohol and provision of late night refreshment. No other licensable activities are applied for. The hours applied for are from 12:00hrs to 02:00hrs Tuesday and Sunday; 12:00hrs to 03:00am Monday, Wednesday and Thursday; and 12:00hrs to 04:00hrs on Friday and Saturday.

Cambridgeshire Constabulary wish to make a formal representation in relation to this application. We seek to reject the application unless the applicant can consider and apply the following recommendations / amendments to the application.

309 Lincoln Road is a retail unit located centrally within the densely occupied retail / residential area of Lincoln Road. This area is subject to a Cumulative Impact Area (Special Policy) drawn up and adopted on 18th April 2013 and reviewed and continued in 2015. It has been positively identified that there is a significant concentration of licensed premises within the Millfield / Gladstone area, and there is sufficient evidence of a negative impact on the statutory licensing objectives. Peterborough City Council's 'Statement of Licensing Policy', 'Special Policy on Cumulative Effect' - Paragraph 11.6 states:

"This special policy creates a rebuttable presumption that applications within the Op Can Do area for <u>new premises</u> or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, if relevant representations are received about the cumulative impact on the licensing objectives, unless the applicant can demonstrate why the operation of the premises involved will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced".


"Applications will need to address the special policy issues in their operating schedules in order to rebut such a presumption".

The area surrounding 309 Lincoln Road has been specifically identified as having high levels of crime and anti-social behaviour, often associated to the saturation of licensed premises and abuse of alcohol. There is a direct correlation between the location of licensed premises and reports of noise, littering, violence and other forms of anti-social behaviour. This is not surprising when you consider that the immediate area is densely populated with families from a large variety of nationalities and backgrounds, living and working in housing stock which comprises mainly of Victorian style terracing and multi occupancy flats and houses. It is important to add that the licensed premises have grown up rapidly around people's homes in the last few years — not the other way round.

Already saturated with alcohol retail premises, there are 10 'Off-License' premises and 6 other licensed premises including two large supermarkets within 300 yards, which have contributed either directly or indirectly towards the alcohol harm issues which affect the area. Extending the availability of alcohol in the area via another 'Off sale' premises will undoubtedly hinder this effort and will significantly contribute to the already ever present issues.

In the period 01st January 2016 to November 2017, year on year we have seen decreases in crimes associated with alcohol harm. However, we have seen an increase compared to 2015. The image below demonstrates that in Eastern North sector we have seen an overall increase in violent crime (+36%) and alcohol related incidents (10%). The detailed issues have been dealt with by Police and partners and we strive to reduce the figures further.

Whilst this is potentially another licensed premises within the Cumulative impact area ultimately the decision on granting the license lies with the Licensing Sub-Committee. The applicant has offered comprehensive conditions for inclusion on the license. I wish to offer a revision to these conditions that provide transparency.

I am aware that the applicant has been approached via his legal representation. However in the absence of a response either way, I am submitting this representation against the grant of the license. Should the applicant consider and choose to adopt my recommendations I see no need for a formal review of the application.

I firstly ask that *the sale of alcohol is restricted to 01:00am daily*. Whilst portraying itself as a *Restaurant* I feel that the premises *should be restricted to 'On' sale of alcohol only*. Conditions within the application suggest that alcohol will be sold with 'Take-away' food. I may be swayed if this was 'carry-out' alcohol following a substantial meal but feel it is alcohol being sold ancillary to a 'Take-Away' order. Allowing this to happen up to 04:00am in the morning would offer a continuation of available alcohol in an area already saturated and effected by alcohol harm.

I have reviewed the conditions offered by the applicant. For the sake of clarity and compliance I offer the following conditions which will be placed on the license.

Prevention of Crime -

- 1. The Premises License Holder and/or Designated premises supervisor will maintain an 'Incident report register' in a bound book, in which full details of all incidents are recorded, and all staff have access to. This shall be completed as soon as possible and in any case no later than the close of business on the day of the incident. The time and date when the report was completed, and by whom, is to form part of the entry. The register is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to a Police Officer or an authorized Officer when requested. The records should be retained for a minimum of 12 months.
- 2. The premises licence holder will ensure that a digital CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.informationcommissioner.gov.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
- 3. The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of a least 2 hours afterwards
- 4. A digital CCTV system shall cover all areas of the premises to which the public have access including any outside areas; and shall be retained for a minimum of 31 days;

- and should be produced to a Police Officer or authorised officer immediately upon request.
- 5. The CCTV system shall be capable of downloading images to a recognizable viewable format and will offer an unrestricted identifiable facial image of each person that enters the property in all light conditions.
- 6. At all times the premises are open for business a member of staff shall be present who is capable of operating the digital CCTV system and downloading images at the request of a Police Officer or authorised officer.
- 7. If the CCTV equipment (including any mobile units in use at the premises) breaks down the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor shall ensure that they verbally inform both the Police & Licensing Authority as soon as is reasonably practicable. This information should be contemporaneously recorded in the incident report register and shall include the time, date and means this was done and to whom the information was reported. Equipment failures shall be repaired or replaced as soon as is reasonably practicable and without undue delay. The Police and Licensing Authority shall be informed when faults are rectified.
- 8. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted up so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.
- 9. Written staff training records will be documented and updated on at least a 6 monthly basis, or where there is a change of staff. These training records will be produced to a Police Officer or authorised officer on demand.
- 10. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available at the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

Public Nuisance -

- 11. The premise license holder shall not participate or encourage flyposting of events or the venue and any leaflet distribution shall be managed in such a way as to prevent litter.
- 12. The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that noise caused by persons using, arriving at or departing from the premises shall not cause nuisance or unreasonable disturbance to the occupiers of residential properties.
- 13. Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits **[and in outdoor areas]** requesting customers and staff to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 14. The holder of the premises license shall ensure that no music or amplified speech originating from the premises shall be audible inside any residential property *(or hotel bedroom/other specified relevant receptor)* at any time.
- 15. All external doors and windows must be kept closed, other than for access and egress.
- 16. Disposal of waste bottles into external receptacles where noise will be audible to neighbouring properties must not occur between 23:00 and 07:00 hours.
- 17. The premises license holder will ensure that any patrons smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

Public Safety -

- 18. A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorized officer.
- 19. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises
- 20. Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the schedule shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer on request.

Protection of children from harm -

- 21. The 'Challenge 25' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises and signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operates the 'Challenge 25' initiative.
- 22. Signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operate the 'Challenge 25' initiative.
- 23. Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink must do so under the authority of a personal licence holder and must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to believe that the individual may be less than 25 years of age.
- 24. A refusal log will be accurately maintained on every refusal made in relation to the attempted purchase of alcohol by a juvenile or intoxicated person.

I am the Chair of Millfield & New England Regeneration Partnership (MANERP) which represents residents who live in the Millfield and New England areas of Peterborough. The reason for writing is to request that the application for a Premises License be refused on that part of the application regarding the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. We have no objection regarding the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises.

The Millfield and New England area of Peterborough has had for several years a history of anti-social behaviour fuelled by alcohol and drug abuse. This has been exacerbated by the rapid growth of a number of outlets retailing alcohol by means of "off-sales."

The area is also within the boundary of the "Can-Do" initiative which has brought together the city council, police, NHS, Resident Associations and other partner agencies to jointly combat the serious issues being faced in this area.

It must also be noted that the area was made a Cumulative Impact Zone whereby the applicant needs to prove that there is a need for selling alcohol "off sales". The premises in this application is surrounded by shops retailing alcohol and cannot therefore, prove that there is a need.

The whole area is very sensitive and volatile because of the ease of access to the purchase of alcohol often sold at a low price in order to attract customers or be competitive.

As the Millfield and New England area has a phenomenal number of outlets selling alcohol "off-sales" (around the seventy plus mark) which has contributed significantly to anti-social behaviour in the area. The current joint partnership between Peterborough City Council, Cambridgeshire Police and

other partner agencies through the "Can-Do" initiative has highlighted the need to reduce the number of outlets and hours that alcohol can be freely purchased, if it is to make any headway towards the goals that it is striving to achieve.

With this and the Cumulative Impact Policy in mind, we also make this representation under the following Licensing Objectives set out in the Licensing Act 2003.

- a) The prevention of crime and disorder
- b) Public safety
- c) The prevention of public nuisance

The MANERP primary aim is to try to regenerate an area that has been sadly neglected for many years. The largest single problem of all revolves around the ease, low cost but above all, availability at which alcohol can be purchased and subsequently abused.

We therefore respectfully request that the "off sales" part of this application be refused by the Licensing Committee for the reasons stated above. We would reiterate that we have no objection for the sale and consumption of alcohol within the restaurant.
