1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for the review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 served by Peterborough & Cambridgeshire Trading Standards in relation to the above premises at Appendix B page 9. The review was bought under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On the 27th of March 2017 an application to transfer the premises licence for London Road Late Night Stores to Azad Jomaa Mohamed was submitted, at the same time a Designated Premises Supervisor-DPS variation was submitted for Mr Mohammed to become the DPS. Both applications received no representations and were subsequently granted after the 14 day consultation.
- 2.2 The review application outlines the details of the non-duty seizures. After these seizures the Licence holder Mr Mohammed submitted applications to transfer the licence to a colleague Rizgar Jamal Ahmed. These applications were placed on hold pending the submission of right to work documents that must accompany licence applications. Mr Ahmed (new applicant) has now provided right to work documents (Indefinite Leave to Remain) and these applications will be processed pending the outcome of the sub committee hearing.
- 2.3 Twenty one legible letters of support attached at Appendix C page 25 have been submitted to the Licensing section from local residents. In the main the letters state that there have been improvements to the general running of the store since Mr Mohamed has taken over.

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Peterborough & Cambridgeshire Trading Standards, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.
- 3.2 A letter of support has been received from PC Grahame Robinson, Cambridgeshire Constabulary. This letter of support is attached at Appendix D on page 53.
- 3.3 No representations have been received from any other of the Responsible Authorities i.e. Home Office, Public Health Authority, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council Planning Department, Peterborough City Council Health & Safety Department, Peterborough City Council Environmental Pollution Team, or Children's Services.
- 3.4 A statutory 'Notice' was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no. 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005.

4. SUMMARY OF ISSUES RAISED BY TRADING STANDARDS

- On the 21st of August 2017 a seizure of 560 foreign labelled cigarettes was made by Cambridgeshire Constabulary from Mr Azad Mohammed that were found under the counter.
- On the 28th September 2017 a joint initiative by Trading Standards, HMRC and Cambridgeshire Police was carried out to clamp down on the illicit tobacco and alcohol trade
- A seizure of 2200 cigarettes and 400g of hand rolling tobacco and 1200 litres of Polish beer was made. Mr Mohammed had 30 days to provide HM Revenue & Customs documentation to establish the duty liability of the alcohol and evidence of the alcohol and evidence of duty payment. This time scale has passed since the seizure and alcohol is therefore deemed ass condemned as forfeit to the crown.

6. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 6.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Trading Standards (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 29 November 2018.
- 6.3 The application before this committee will consider
 - (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 6.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
 - (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

- 6.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:
- 6.6 The licensing authority may decide that the review does not require it to take any further steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such informal warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be in issued in writing to the licence holder. However, where responsible authorities such as the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement either orally or in writing that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this into account when considering what further action is appropriate.'

LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

The relevant Licensable Activities

- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Live Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013.

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).
- Home Office (immigration)

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days);
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

Recommendations;

A revocation of the alcohol licence.

Reasons for the above recommendation;

Trading Standards as a responsible authority recommends revocation due to the seriousness of the illicit trade.

This is supported by guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 11.27 There is a certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously.

One of them being;

- for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

Guidance states - It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities in crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence - even in the first instance - should be seriously considered.



3.	Cameras must be positioned so that they cover the front aspect/entrance of the premises and all retail areas. The system must be maintained and a record kept. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the CCTV must be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
4.	A notice, clearly visible to members of the public, must be displayed advising that CCTV is installed.
5.	All staff engaged in the sale or supply of alcohol at the premises should be either the holder of a personal licence or be trained to the minimum standard provided for in the level 1 award in responsible alcohol retailing (ARAR). (Training includes the means of identifying and preventing the sale of alcohol to any person who is or appears to be drunk.)
6.	A record of training to be kept and made available to the police and licensing authority. Persons not holding a personal licence must be retrained every three months, a written record maintained and made available on demand of an officer from a responsible authority
7.	The holder of a personal licence must be on the premises at any time alcohol is available for sale or supply
8.	No alcohol is to be purchased by the leaseholders or their manager from vendors who call at the premises
9.	Invoices (originals or copies) relating to the purchase of alcohol stocks must be kept at the premises and made available on request of an officer of a responsible authority or HMRC
10.	The premises must maintain an ultra-violet light and if any spirits are identified as non-fluorescent or are otherwise suspicious the premises licence holder or DPS must inform the trading standards department and HMRC as soon as possible
11.	Spirits offered for sale must be displayed behind the sales counter and not be available by self service
12.	It shall not be permitted to take drinks in open containers from the premises







Re: Trading Standards review application – London Road Late Store

On the 29th November 2017 Cambridgeshire Constabulary received notification of a Licencing review application submitted by Peterborough City Council Trading Standards. The review application refers to the 'Off' Licensed premises called 'London Road Food & Wine' at 64 London Road, Woodston 77 Mayors Walk, Peterborough, PE2 9BA. The Premises Licence reference 075045 is held by Mr. Azad Jomaa Mohamed. He is also the designated premises supervisor and holds an Alcohol Personal Licence No: LBHIL3640 issued by London Borough of Hillingdon.

The Premises License and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) was transferred over to Mr. Mohamed on 30th March 2017. The Premises License allows for the sale of alcohol daily between 08:00hrs and 23:00hrs.

At 11:00hrs on Monday 21st August 2017 a compliance inspection was carried out by myself and Mr Darren Dolby, Peterborough City Council Licensing Officer. I carried out a search in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 and discovered on a shelf under the till foreign labelled cigarettes namely:

- 400 x Russian Winston Blue Cigarettes
- 160 x Lithuanian Marlboro Gold

Mr Mohamed stated that the cigarettes belonged to a member of staff – who he named but could not confirm any further details such as address or contact number. Amazingly he clarified that this random person was just helping him out. The cigarettes were seized and Mr. Mohamed was given a stern verbal warning. I later informed Peterborough City Council Trading Standards.

During the compliance inspection a number of minor issues were found that rendered Mr. Mohammed non-compliant with the Licensing Act under the remit of his Premises License. These issues, which included insufficient CCTV, an incomplete Fire Risk Assessment and absent staff training records were noted by Mr Dolby and the licensee was given a period of time to rectify. I formed the impression that



Mr Mohamed may not be fit and proper to hold a premises license but agreed to give him the time to rectify the identified issues and gain compliance through advice and guidance.

On Tuesday 29th August 2017 Mr. Dolby and I re-visited the shop and spoke with Mr Mohamed about the previously identified lack of compliance. A number of issues had not been rectified and Mr. Mohamed was given further advice and another warning. A compliance search was carried out and nothing illicit or illegal was found on this occasion.

On 28th September 2017 Trading Standards, Cambridgeshire Constabulary and HMRC carried out an inspection of 'London Road Late Store'. A significant seizure of counterfeit and illicit cigarettes and alcohol were made (as per Trading Standards review application).

The Licensee initially failed a compliance inspection and illicit cigarettes were found on the premises. The verbal warning given by myself was clear and concise in that any further seizures would result in the review of the premises license. Clearly knowing the wrongs in such activity, Mr Mohamed has continued to be a party to secreted goods within the store, potentially to sell for his or someone else's gain. This leads me to seriously doubt whether Mr Mohamed is fit and proper to sell alcohol or hold a premises license.

Cambridgeshire Constabulary fully support the ongoing operation and partnership with Trading Standards and HMRC in a positive effort to prevent and deter counterfeit / illicit cigarettes and alcohol being sold or supplied in Peterborough.

We take a very serious view on the sale of illicit / counterfeit goods. This is a serious breach upon the licencing objective to prevent crime and disorder, and in my opinion does not promote public safety. Such crime has a detrimental effect upon the immediate community and can be harmful to unwitting customers including children. Foreign cigarettes and hand rolling tobacco are not subject to the strict regulation and control measures that would benefit UK authorised sale items and in most cases have not had UK duty paid on them. Distribution and sale of illicit / counterfeit goods is linked to serious and organised crime and nationally is a drain on the economy.

Section 182 Guidance - Licensing Act 2003 Para 11.27 states -

"There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously".

This includes amongst other criminal activity –

"The sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol".

Para 11.28 states -

"It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered".

Cambridgeshire Constabulary support Trading Standards in submitting their review application and also ask for the Licensing Sub-Committee to seriously consider revoking the Premises licence held by Mr Mohamed.
