

**Programme Overview:**

- Focused on improving the wider determinants of health that can have a significant impact on our health and wellbeing.

**Key Milestone:**

Develop and implement a Healthy Workplaces programme including implementation of the national Public Health Responsibility Deal to support indicators:

- Sickness absence – the number of employees who had at least one day off in the previous week
- Sickness absence – the percentage of working days lost due to sickness absence

**Additional Programme Key Metrics:**

The percentage of the population affected by noise – Number of complaints about noise		
↑	England average affected by noise (7.5 per 1000)	Peterborough average affected by noise (5.5 per 1000)
There are a number of direct and indirect links between exposure to noise and health and wellbeing.

The government’s strategy for public health includes a focus on the working age population, helping people with a health condition stay in or return to work.

**Statutory homelessness – homelessness acceptances**

Homelessness is associated with severe poverty and is a social determinant of health.

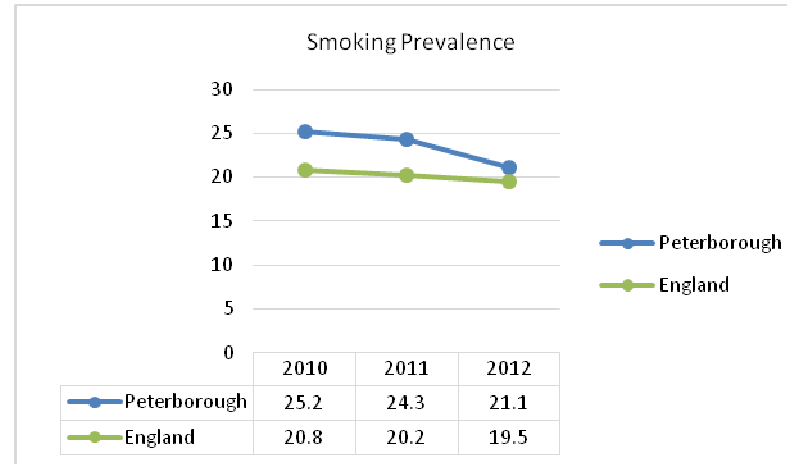
Most recent data has demonstrated a reduction in smoking prevalence locally by over 4% in recent years.

Smoking prevalence in Peterborough is also reducing at a faster rate than the England average, with prevalence in Peterborough now similar to the national average rather than being significantly higher.

At 34.3% smoking prevalence among routine and manual workers is also reducing at a faster rate than the England average, however prevalence among this group remains higher than the England average.

Prevalence of smoking at time of delivery has increased and as such further focused delivery activity is being undertaken.

**Additional Programme Key Metrics:**

Breastfeeding – Prevalence at 6-8 weeks after birth		
↓	England prevalence at 6-8 weeks is 47.2%	England prevalence at 6-8 weeks is 41.4%
Breastfeeding initiation is very similar to England average at 73.6% but this level of performance is not sustained as demonstrated by red rating for 6-8 weeks prevalence.		

Excess Weight (4-5 year olds)		
↔	England excess weight rates among 4-5 year olds (22.2%)	Peterborough excess weight rates among 4-5 year olds (23.4%)
Excess weight in children (also measured at 10-11 years) is not significantly different to national levels		

Cancer Screening Coverage – Breast Cancer		
↔	England % of eligible women screened adequately within previous 3 years (76.3%)	Peterborough % of eligible women screened adequately within previous 3 years (76.0%)
Breast cancer screening is very similar but cervical cancer screening is significantly worse than England average.

- Commissioning of integrated sexual health services for Peterborough's population
- Working with PHE Centre and NHS England Public Health Team to improve population vaccination coverage

**Programme Key Metrics:**

Chlamydia diagnoses (15-24 year olds)		
↔	England 1979 diagnoses per 100,000 young people	Peterborough 2446 diagnoses per 100,000 young people

The DH recommends local areas achieve an annual chlamydia diagnosis rate of **at least 2,446** per 100,000 15-24 year old resident population. Peterborough is on track to achieve this level through good screening coverage.

**Population vaccination coverage**

↔	England MMR (dose 1) 92.3%	Peterborough MMR (dose 1) 92.6%
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Ongoing national and local campaign for MMR catch-up immunisation

**Treatment completion for tuberculosis (TB)**

↔	England treatment completion rate 82.8%	Peterborough treatment completion 86.5%
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Peterborough has higher incidence rate of TB (28.9/100,000) than England (15.1/100,000) and the challenge is to maintain performance on case detection and treatment completion

  - NHS Health Checks Programme
  - Prevention in primary care
  - Smoking cessation and tobacco control
  - Cardiac rehabilitation
- Working with NHS England to monitor cancer screening rates for Peterborough; and raise awareness of symptoms and risk factors among the population
- Reducing infant mortality rate through addressing risk factors in pregnancy and first year of life
