The Cabinet Member is recommended to:

1. Authorise the Council entering into a Section 256 Agreement with the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group for receipt of funding relating to health support to children and young people.

1. SUMMARY OF MAIN ISSUES

- 1.1 This report seeks the Cabinet Member for Integrated Adult Social Care and Health's approval to enter a Section 256 agreement with NHS Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group, relating to the receipt of £514 000 funding to deliver health support to children and young people in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

2. PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

- 2.1 This report is for the Cabinet Member for Integrated Adult Social Care and Health to consider exercising delegated authority under paragraph 3.4.3 of Part 3 of the constitution in accordance with the terms of their portfolio at paragraph (d).

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4. **DETAILS OF DECISION REQUIRED**

- 4.1 Cambridgeshire and Peterborough CCG developed, with partners, a local transformation plan which outlined priorities for promoting and improving the emotional wellbeing and mental health for children and young people (C&YP) across Peterborough and Cambridgeshire. This plan has been refreshed for 2016/17 and provides further information on the changes implemented locally and our areas for further development
- 4.2 The plan provides a collective vision for children and young people to address the emotional and mental health needs of it children and young people's population.
- 4.3 Peterborough City Council has been a key stakeholder in developing the Local Transformation Plan. Funding has been allocated to Peterborough City Council and Cambridgeshire County Council to provide a range of services for children, young people and families to support the emotional and mental health of this community, including the provision of evidence based parenting programmes, counselling services and provision of resources for children and young people to support good emotional and mental health.
- 4.4 Pursuant to section 256 of the National Health Service Act 2006, payments will be made from Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group to the Council under a section 256 agreement.
- 4.5 The total amount of funding to be received by the Council under this agreement will be £514,000 to cover the period 1 April 2016 to 31 March 2017.

5. **CONSULTATION**

- 5.1 The Local Transformation Plan involved significant involvement of key stakeholders, including Cambridgeshire County Council, Peterborough City Council, the Clinical Commissioning Group, local providers, voluntary sector organisations and schools. Delivery plans have been built around the identified need and consultation.
- 5.2 Children, young people and their families, including carers have also been engaged in developing the Local Transformation Plan. This engagement continues through local parent participation groups who continues to provide feedback on services delivered through the local transformation plans.

6. **ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES**

- 6.1 Funding for the Council that ensures the integrated provision of emotional and mental health provision for children, young people and their families.

7. **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS & ANY RELEVANT BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- 7.1 The Section 256 agreement will enable the delivery of a range of services for children, young people and their families, which will be delivered in an integrated way with key partners, thereby improving outcomes for children and young people.

8. ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 8.1 To do nothing – this was rejected as the agreement between Peterborough City Council and the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough CCG enable to delivery of a wider range of services to children and young people, which will improve outcomes for this group.

Section 256 of the National Health Service Act 2006 provides authority for a clinical commissioning group to make payments to a local authority if the clinical commissioning group is satisfied that the payment is likely to secure a more effective use of public funds than the deployment of an equivalent amount on the provision of services.
