## Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

### Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

	This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:
1.	No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when  (a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2.	Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3.	(a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.  (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.  (c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-  (i) a holographic mark or (ii) an ultraviolet feature.
4.	<b>1.</b> A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. <b>2.</b> For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1— (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979 (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula— $P = D + (D \times V)$ where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

**3.** Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

**4.—(1)** Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### **Door Supervision (where supervisors are engaged this condition applies)**

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## Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

### All Licensing Objectives

#### Crime and Disorder

1.	A working intruder alarm will be maintained.
2.	The premises must install and maintain a CCTV system to the satisfaction of the police and licensing authority. The system must record and store digital images for not less than 28 days.
3.	Cameras must be positioned so that they cover the front aspect/entrance of the premises and all retail areas. The system must be maintained and a record kept. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the CCTV must be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
4.	A notice, clearly visible to members of the public, must be displayed advising that CCTV is installed.
5.	All staff engaged in the sale or supply of alcohol at the premises should be either the holder of a personal licence or be trained to the minimum standard provided for in the level 1 award in responsible alcohol retailing (ARAR). (Training includes the means of identifying and preventing the sale of alcohol to any person who is or appears to be drunk.)
6.	A record of training to be kept and made available to the police and licensing authority. Persons not holding a personal licence must be retrained every three months, a written record maintained and made available on demand of an officer from a responsible authority
7.	The holder of a personal licence must be on the premises at any time alcohol is available for sale or supply
8.	No alcohol is to be purchased by the leaseholders or their manager from vendors who call at the premises
9.	Invoices (originals or copies) relating to the purchase of alcohol stocks must be kept at the premises and made available on request of an officer of a responsible authority or HMRC
10.	The premises must maintain an ultra-violet light and if any spirits are identified as non-fluorescent or are otherwise suspicious the premises licence holder or DPS must inform the trading standards department and HMRC as soon as possible
11.	Spirits offered for sale must be displayed behind the sales counter and not be available by self service
12.	It shall not be permitted to take drinks in open containers from the premises

13.	A record of refusals must be maintained & produced on request of an officer from a responsible authority

14.	A risk assessment must be undertaken relating to noise and vibration on all external/internal plant or equipment to ensure such equipment is inaudible in any adjacent properties
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### **Protection of Children from Harm**

15.	The premises to adopt a system of age verification whereby any person who does not appear to be 25 years of age will be required to produce id in the form of a passport, photographic driving licence or an id card displaying the 'pass' hologram logo.
