Additional Highway Condition

As discussed within the Committee Report, the Local Highway Authority (LHA) have reviewed the submitted Transport Assessment and additional modelling provided, and have raised no objections to the proposal, however, it is anticipated that off-site highway improvements may be required, taking into account the increase in traffic movements associated with this Phase of the University development.

As such, Officers are seeking to attach the following condition, which would be informed by two sensitivity tests, which would be fed into the on-going Embankment Area Transport Study that is currently being carried out by Milestone. Depending on the outcome of this additional information, this may require a financial contribution towards off-site highway works, which would be captured by a Section 106 legal agreement.


No development shall take place above slab level unless and until all parties with an interest in the land have entered into a planning obligation pursuant to Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) to secure any necessary off-site highways improvements within the vicinity of the application site.

Reason: To ensure that the local highway network has the capacity to take the additional traffic generated by the development, in accordance with Policy LP13 of the Peterborough Local Plan (2019).

Paragraph 95 of NPPF (2021) states that local planning authorities should take a proactive, positive and collaborative approach to meeting educational requirements. Therefore, in accordance with Paragraph 96 of the NPPF (2021), whereby local planning authorities are expected to work proactively and positively with promoters, delivery partners and statutory bodies, Officers are seeking to secure this information by condition to ensure faster delivery of this important public service, and to enable them to commence the development within a timely manner.

Bus Stop Provision

At Committee site visit, Cllr Sharpe enquired about bus stop provision for the University. Phase 1 secured a temporary bus stop provision on Bishops Road by way of a legal agreement, the temporary bus stop of which shall be implemented by March 2024, with a permanent solution by 2027. The reason for the delayed provision relates to the phased occupancy of the Phase 1 University building.



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
