Public Questions

These questions have been submitted and reviewed by the Chair in accordance with sections 7.11 and 7.12.

Questions from Ms Edna Murphy.

1. The report (Delivery of the Police and Crime Commissioner's Crime Plan 2021-24 Progress Report) is very vague on what, precisely, is being done to keep people safe from this under-reported and often devastating crime. How can you show that you are making progress in this area, both preventing fraud from occurring in the first place, and successfully investigating and supporting the conviction of those you do not manage to prevent?
2. Can the Police and Crime Commissioner please explain why the Progress Report seems to lack any reference to restorative justice initiatives, or if it is there by another name how extensively is it funded and what have been the outcomes for Cambridgeshire?

Question from Mr Daniel Fulton.

1. Does the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner have any mechanisms in place to monitor the performance of the constabulary in regard to serious disclosure failures, and if not, would the Police and Crime Commissioner be willing to consider developing a mechanism that would allow these issues to be subject to regular monitoring and oversight?

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
