1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider and determine an application for a review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, taking into account the representation made by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in their capacity as a Responsible Authority. The review was bought under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Protection of children from harm objectives.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On the 21st July 2008, an application for a new premises licence was submitted by I Din & Sons Ltd to allow the sale of alcohol Monday to Saturday from 8.00am to 10.00pm and 8.00am to 6.00pm on Sunday. As no valid representations were received the licence was granted on 18th August 2008. The original name of the premises as per the application was Saunders News. A copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix B - Page 9**.
- 2.2 On the 17th July 2010, an application to change the premises name to 'Westgate News & Off Licence' was made.
- 2.3 A Test Purchase of alcohol took place at the premises on 12th February 2009 and the premises refused the sale of alcohol to the underage volunteers.
- 2.4 A Test Purchase took place at the premises on 16th April 2009 and alcohol was sold to an underage volunteer. The member of staff who sold the alcohol, Mr Ishtiaq Ahmed, was, and still is, the Designated Premises Supervisor at the store. Mr Ahmed was issued with a Penalty Notice for Disorder (PND) for this offence. On this occasion both Police and Council Licensing Officers assisted the premises with putting in place guidance, policies and training records to prevent underage sales.
- 2.5 On the 3rd June 2010 a test purchase took place at the premises and alcohol was sold to the underage volunteers by a member of staff who later received a Penalty Notice for

Disorder (PND) for this offence. As there was due diligence in place on this occasion, including a 'Challenge 21' policy it was deemed not appropriate to prosecute the Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder on this occasion. The premises did however voluntarily change their age verification policy to 'Challenge 25' after this failure.

- 2.6 On 3rd September 2010 a further Test Purchase took place at the premises and alcohol was sold to an underage volunteer. A PND was issued to the seller of the alcohol and the investigation with regards to the Designated Premises Supervisor and Premises Licence Holder is ongoing.
- 2.7 As there had been two test purchase failures in the space of three months the Premises Licence Holder is also under investigation for the offence of 'Persistently Selling Alcohol to Children'.
- 2.8 A recent Test Purchase on 26th October 2010 resulted in shop staff refusing the sale of alcohol to the underage volunteers.

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003, following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Cambridgeshire Constabulary, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.
- 3.2 A copy of the application to review, which was received at these offices on 5th October 2010 is attached at **Appendix C – Page 17**.
- 3.3 A copy of the 'Notice' that was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 – The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 is attached at **Appendix D – Page 25**.
- 3.4 A letter of support to the application was received from Children's Social Care Services in their capacity as a Responsible Authority. This letter can be found at **Appendix E – Page 27**. No other representations have been received from any of the remaining Responsible Authorities, interested parties or the Licence holder.

4.1 Summary of issues raised by Cambridgeshire Constabulary

- I. Sale of alcohol to individuals under the age of 18, on three separate occasions in two years.

- II. Advisory meetings, issuing training packages and advice regarding age verification policies have taken place, but sales to underage persons continue to occur.
- III. Concerns for the safety of children and the premises not upholding the objectives.

5 LICENSING OFFICERS COMMENTS

- 5.1 Mediation had not been able to take place between the parties to the hearing as the representatives of the Premises Licence Holders were in Pakistan attending a family funeral.
- 5.2 All test purchasing is done in accordance with LACoRS Guidelines which are endorsed by the Home Office. The volunteers used are aged between 14 and 16 and must answer truthfully if questioned by a retailer. Premises are targeted for test purchasing following complaints made to the council from members of the public or intelligence received by the police.

7. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 7.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council") is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Cambridgeshire Constabulary (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 7.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 5th October 2010.
- 7.3 The application before this committee will consider –
 - (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 7.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are –
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
 - (e) to revoke the licenceand for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added
- 7.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

'The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the

licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be issued in writing to the holder of the licence. But, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvements – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

‘Child’

(a) means an individual aged under 16

(b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

‘Designated Premises Supervisor’ means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

‘Interested parties’:

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association.

‘Late Night Refreshment’ means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

‘Licensable Activities’ means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

‘Licensing Authority’: - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

‘Licensed Premises’ includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

‘Licensing Objectives’

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

‘Operating Schedule’ means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

‘Rateable Value’: as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

‘Regulated Entertainment’ (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

Or the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

‘Relevant Licensing Authority’: is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

‘Responsible Authority’ means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health – Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children’s Services – Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

‘Supply of alcohol’:

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

‘Temporary Event Notice’ means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration – they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale – they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises – the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and

- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time – a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

‘the Act’: means the Licensing Act 2003

‘Vicinity’: Given the normal everyday meaning of being ‘near to’ when considering the relevance of representations received from individual’s residence or business.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when
 - (a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

All Licensing Objectives

Crime and Disorder

3. Video/CCTV equipment shall be installed inside the premises and maintained in working order.
4. Video/CCTV equipment will be set to record from the time that the premises open to the public until the premises close and all members of the public have left.
5. Images shall be retained for at least one month and shall be produced to an authorised officer on demand.
6. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted up so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.
7. No customers will be admitted, or permitted to leave when carrying open bottles or glasses.
8. No alcohol shall be consumed on the premises.
9. Any grills and / or alarms installed at the licensed premises shall be maintained in working order.

Public Safety

10. A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorized officer.
11. Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the schedule shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer on request.

Protection of Children from Harm

118. The 'Challenge 21' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises.
119. Signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operates the 'Challenge 21' initiative.
120. A refusals register will be kept for underage sales and produced to an authorised officer on request.

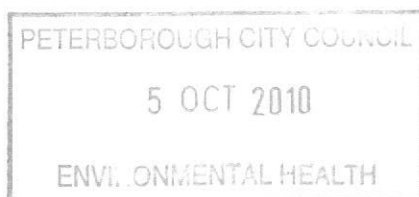

These premises have in the last two years failed three underage test purchasing of alcohol operations.

The dates of the failures and actions taken are as follows :

- 16 April 2009 - PND issued to the seller who was also the Designated Premises Supervisor (Mr Ishtiaq Ahmed)
- 3 June 2010 - PND issued to the seller
- 3 September 2010 - Still under investigation

It appears from the above failures that both the Premises License Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) have been unable to uphold the three Licensing objectives mentioned earlier.

On each of the first 2 failed test purchases support was given to the DPS and Premises Licence Holder by both Police and Council Officers. This support included issuing the DPS with a 'staff training' pack and the advice to adopt a 'Challenge 25' age check policy. Both these measures were introduced at the store and were in operation when the third failure occurred.

On investigation of the 3rd failure it was found that the seller had not completed the training pack that had been supplied. The 'Challenge 25' policy (ie that if a person looks under the age of 25 they must provide identification to prove they are 18 or over) was in place and signs displaying this were evident.

As the premises had failed 2 test purchases in a period of 3 months they are also currently under investigation for an offence of ' Persistently selling alcohol to children'.

These continued failures constitute a danger to children and young people and also increase the likelihood of issues directly associated with anti-social behaviour and criminality.

- A revocation of their alcohol license

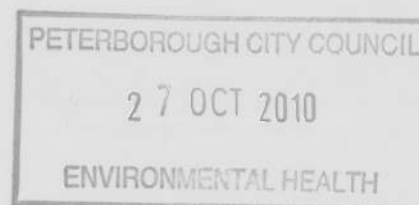
