### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for a review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, taking into account the representation made by Trading Standards in their capacity as a Responsible Authority, and letter of support of the review and recommendations from Cambridgeshire Constabulary also a Responsible Authority. The review was bought under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective.

### 2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On the 6 August 2005 an application was submitted by Mr Mohammed Tanveer to convert a Justices off licence to a premises licence. As no objections from the police were received the licence was granted 20 September 2005.
- 2.2 On the 5 May 2009 a variation application was received, however as the regulations (with regards to advertising) were not complied with, this application was rejected by the licensing department
- 2.3 On the 14 July 2009 a variation application was submitted by Mr Mohammed Tanveer to extend the hours for the off sale of alcohol. As no objections were received the licence was granted on 12 August 2009. A copy of this current licence is attached at **Appendix B Page 7**

### 3. APPLICATION

3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Trading Standards, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.

- 3.2 A copy of the application to review was received 29 June 2011, a copy of this application is attached at **Appendix C Page 15**
- 3.3 A copy of the 'Notice' that was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no. 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005 is attached at **Appendix D Page 21**
- 3.4 A representation in support of the review and recommendations was received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary as a Responsible Authority, a copy of this representation is attached at **Appendix E Page 23**
- 3.5 No other representations have been received from any of the remaining Responsible Authorities or any interested parties.

### 4.1 Summary of issues raised by Responsible Authorities

- i. Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC) have seized alleged non UK duty paid alcohol from the premises.
- ii. The premises have failed to provide documentation for the seized alcohol to prove UK duty had been paid.
- iii. The UK Duty evaded was £414.61
- iv. Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 recommends revocation, even in the first instance.

### 5. STATEMENT AND SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION SUBMITTED

- 5.1 A witness statement of Parvez Akhtar with covering letter from hc Solicitors was received on 28 July 2011 disputing the allegation that the premises has been trading in illicit goods. This is attached at **Appendix F Page 25**
- 5.2 Mr Akhtar also supplied copies of invoices which do not directly relate to the products seized, however Mr Akhtar states that they show that he makes purchases from reputable traders paying all appropriate duty. A copy of these invoices are attached at **Appendix G Page 29**

### 6. LICENSING OFFICERS COMMENTS

6.1 Section 11.23 of Guidance (issued under section 182) states, 'A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with licensable activities. For example, reviews may arise because of drugs problems at the premises or money laundering by criminal gangs or the sale of contraband or stolen goods there or the sale of firearms. Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issues. This is a matter for the courts of law. The role of the licensing authority when determining such a review is not therefore to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual, but to ensure that the crime prevention objective is promoted.

### 8. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 8.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Trading Standards (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 8.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 29 June 2011.
- 8.3 The application before this committee will consider
  - (i) The application to review the licence,
  - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 8.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
  - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
  - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
  - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
  - (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added

8.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be in issued in writing to the holder of the licence. But, where responsible authorities like the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvements – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.

### LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

**'Designated Premises Supervisor'** means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

### 'Interested parties':

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association
- a member of the relevant licensing authority.

**'Late Night Refreshment'** means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

#### 'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

### 'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises

The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

### 'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

### **Or** the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

### 'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

### 'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

**'Temporary Event Notice'** means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and

• The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time – a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003

**'Vicinity'**: Given the normal everyday meaning of being 'near to' when considering the relevance of representations received from individual's residence or business.





On 19<sup>th</sup> April 2011 a joint initiative by Trading Standards, HMRC and Cambridgeshire Police was carried out to clamp down on the illicit tobacco and alcohol trade

HMRC officers seized a total of 18.2 Litres Vodka, 93.75 Litres Wine and 168grms Blunt Wrap from Saaffarant Parbez, who was working in the premises at the time, as liable to forfeiture by virtue of the Customs & Excise Acts.

The owner Parvez Aktar was spoken to via telephone at the time of the visit.

They were satisfied that due to the proprietors inability to produce invoices or receipts to prove duty payment, that United Kingdom Excise Duty had not been paid on said goods.

The revenue due on the seized goods is £414.61

The goods were seized in accordance with section 139 of Customs & Excise Management Act 1979.

No notice of claim against forfeiture was received within the statutory time limit therefore the Vodka, Wine and Blunt Wraps are condemned as forfeited in accordance with paragraph 5 of schedule 3 to the above legislation.

Recommendations:

A revocation of the alcohol licence.

Reasons for the above recommendation;

Trading Standards as a responsible authority recommends revocation due to the seriousness of the illicit trade.

This is supported by guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 11.26 There is a certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously.

One of them being:

- for the sale of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

Guidance states - It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities in crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence - even in the first instance - should be seriously considered.

### <u>Licensing Review - Eastfield News, 32 Eastfield Road, Peterborough</u>

We act for Eastfield News who is the subject of a review of the premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

We have enclosed a copy of a statement provided by Mr Parvez Akhtar who is the proprietor.

The circumstances are that the Applicant attended Eastfield News on the 19<sup>th</sup> of April 2010. After inspecting the premises the HMRC seized a quantity of alcohol and tobacco papers believed to be illicit goods in that the duty had not been paid. The foundation for that belief is that the member of staff present at the time of the HMRC attendance was unable to produce receipts for the goods when asked to do so.

The review application provides insufficient information in respect of the goods seized. Mr Parvez Akhtar was not present at the time of the seizure of his property and is unaware of what stock has been seized. He is therefore unable to provide copies of the invoices for the goods seized.

We respectfully request that the Applicant provides Eastfield News with an inventory of seized goods and the respondent will endeavour to produce the invoices for the goods.

#### WITNESS STATEMENT OF PARVEZ AKHTAR

### I, Parvez Akhtar, say as follows:

- 1. I reside at 138 Cromwell Road, Peterborough PE1 2EU and I am the owner of Eastfield News Off Licence and News Agent of 32 Eastfield Road Peterborough PE1 4AN. I have been the owner of the business for 11 years.
- 2. It is a family run business. The shop is open from 0600 hours until 2300 hours every day. I work approximately 35 to 40 hours a week in the shop. I open the shop three times a week and I close the shop every night.
- 3. I have several family members working for me. They are:
  - a. Mohammed Tanveer Designated Premises Supervisor DOB 20 May 1980 (Brother)
  - b. Bhasharat Hussain DOB 15 August 1991 (son)
  - c. Shaffart Parvez DOB 1 March 1988 (son)
  - d. Mohammed Munir DOB 10 December 1974 (brother)
  - e. Mohammed Saghir (brother-in-law)
- 4. Mohammed Tanveer is the Premises Licence holder and also the Designated Premises Supervisor [DPS]. Mr Tanveer attends the shop everyday in his capacity of DPS.
- 5. I have been served with a copy of the application to review the premises licence and I make this statement in response to the allegations therein.
- 6. We have only ever purchased alcohol or tobacco from reputable sources such as Best Way Cash & Carry Limited, Booker Limited, Hyperama Wholesale and similar trade outlets. We have never knowingly purchased alcohol or tobacco without the duty being included in the purchase price.
- 7. The Applicant states that the HMRC seized a quantity of alcohol and Blunt wraps. The information, in respect of the seized stock, in the review application is insufficient. I am unable to check my invoice records for the purchase invoices unless I am provided with an inventory of what was taken from my shop. My records are extensive and I have a wide and varied stock. It would not assist the Licensing Sub-Committee or the Applicant if I served a copy of my invoices over the last few years. Once I am provided with an inventory of the brands I will endeavour to produce the relevant purchase invoices.
- 8. I reserve the right to produce the invoices to the products seized on the 19<sup>th</sup> of April 2010 once I have been provided with more information.
- 9. I received planning permission to extend the shop premises on 9 June 2010 Ref 10/00491/FUL. This authorised an extension to be built at the shop premises. The building works began in August 2010 and were not completed until October 2010. During the building works it was quite chaotic because we had to move stock around the store to make room for the building works. The building works intruded on the day to day operation of the business.
- 10. When I attend the cash and carry I always obtain a full receipt and invoice for the stock that I have purchased. The invoice is very helpful in that it includes the price for which I bought the products and next to it, a recommended retail price.
- 11. Once the goods are brought to the store, I or one of my colleagues price the goods in accordance with the recommended retail price listed on the invoice. This means that I or one of my colleagues would be provided with the invoice. The invoice is put on the counter and is

used throughout the day as the stock is priced up and shelved/stored. Depending on how busy the store is it can take several hours to price, stack and store the goods that have just been purchased. I can envisage that during the building works that I or one of my colleagues could have misplaced an invoice. I am not aware that I have lost any invoices however during the building works it is possible that this has happened.

- 12. I am not able to ascertain if that is the case until I receive an inventory from the applicant.
- 13. It is not uncommon that wine and vodka stocks can remain in my stock room or on the shelf for some time. These products do not go out of date and therefore if there is a special offer on I will buy excessive stock to take advantage of the deal. This means that I could have wine stocks in my store for a long period of time, even years. Again, I will not be able to produce evidence of a legitimate purchase until the inventory has been provided.
- 14. I was not present at the time of HMRC attendance at my office. My son Shaffart Parvez was present. My son is 23 years old and works part-time. My son would not know how to locate the invoice records that he was asked provide. My accounts are kept separately from the shop stock and there is no reason why he would know where they were.
- 15. I dispute the HMRC's contention that I have been trading goods that have not had the relevant duty paid. I have been trading for many years and I have never traded illicit goods.
- 16. The Applicant proposes that the Licensing Sub-Committee revokes the Premises Licence in respect of our family business. This would be a draconian step to take, particularly when there is no evidence that I have traded in illicit goods.
- 17. I am a local businessman providing a community service. My business supports myself and many members of my family. Without the ability to serve licensable products I would not have a business. I rely on the sale of alcohol to attract customers to the shop who then purchase other convenience items. Even a short suspension of the Premises Licence would cause me great difficulty and place my business in jeopardy.






