1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for a new premises licence for Paradise Peterborough Limited, 83 Eastfield Road, Peterborough, PE1 4AS taking into account the representations received from PC Grahame Robinson of Cambridgeshire Constabulary, as a Responsible Authority, and a valid representation from a member of the public in their capacity as an Interested Party.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On the 15 November 2011 a new application for a premises licence was submitted by Paradise Peterborough Limited.
- 2.2 There is a current premises licence in place for part of 83 Eastfield Road (licence number 062047) which authorises the sale of alcohol until 23.00pm, **Appendix B Page 9**.
- 2.3 Should the licence be granted to Paradise Peterborough Limited this will incorporate the existing licence.

3. SUMMARY OF AUTHORISATIONS APPLIED FOR

- 3.1 i) To allow the retail sale of alcohol for both on and off the premises on Monday to Sunday from 07.00am to 01.00am.
 - ii) To allow recorded music on Monday to Sunday from 07.00am to 23.00pm
 - iii) To allow the premises Late Night Refreshment on Monday to Sunday from 07.00am to 01.00am.
 - iii) To allow the premises to be open on Monday to Sunday from 06.00am to 01.00am

4. APPLICATION & PROPOSED CONDITIONS

4.1 Please refer to the application attached at **Appendix C – Page 21.**

4.2 The applicant has proposed the following conditions be placed upon the licence to meet the four licensing objectives. For clarity and as per paragraph 8.42 of the guidance, these conditions have been translated in to clear and understandable conditions.

4.3 **The Prevention of crime and disorder**

i) CCTV equipment shall be installed inside/outside the premises and maintained in working order.

ii) CCTV recording equipment and associated cameras will be maintained once a week and will record and store digital images for a period not less than 28 days. A record of maintenance is to be kept and made available to an authorised officer upon request. CCTV images are to be produced to an authorised officer upon request

iii) CCTV cameras will be positioned so that they cover the front aspect / entrance of the property in addition to internal public rooms and the customer service area.

iv) Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.

4.4 **Public Safety**

(CCTV conditions as per above) i) Fire Risk Assessment

4.5 **The prevention of public nuisance**

i) Receptacles for refuse storage shall be maintained in a clean condition

ii) Litter shall be prevented at all times and where identified regularly cleared from the vicinity of the premises.

4.6 **The protection of children from harm**

i) Staff training in relation to identifying and preventing sales of alcohol to any person who is, or appears to be drunk should be undertaken on a monthly basis. This training, together with ongoing training to prevent underage sales, such as challenge 21 or challenge 25, should be recorded in a written format and be available to an authorised officer upon demand.

- 4.7 Representations have been received from the Cambridgeshire Constabulary and a member of the public in their capacity as an interested Party. There was also a representation from the council's Pollution Team under the objective of the prevention of public nuisance, later withdrawn due to successful mediation. A copy of the representations are attached at Appendix D Page 45.
- 4.8 The applicant, through mediation, has agreed to a number of further conditions being placed upon the licence. These agreed conditions are shown at paragraph 7.

5. **RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES**

5.1 **Summary of issues raised:**

The extension to the alcohol hours would have a detrimental effect on the local community where issues of noise and disorder will be increased causing further suffering to the local residents.

6 MEDIATION

6.1 Some mediation has taken place between the applicant and the concerning responsible authorities and the applicant has agreed to additional conditions being placed upon the licence.

7. APPLICANT'S AGREED ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

7.1 Crime and disorder

i) CCTV recording equipment and associated cameras will be maintained once a week and will record and store digital images for a period not less than 28 days. A record of maintenance is to be kept and made available to an authorised officer upon request. CCTV images are to be produced to an authorised officer upon request

ii) CCTV cameras will be positioned so that they cover the front aspect / entrance of the property in addition to internal public rooms and the customer service area.

7.2 **Public Nuisance**

i) Noise Control Measures

The licensee shall take reasonable steps to prevent and control noise nuisance caused by persons using the Licensed Premises and also ensure patrons and visitors arrive and depart from the premises in a manner which will not cause annoyance to nearby residents.

ii) Noise Control Measures

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits and outside trading area's, requesting customers and staff to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly. Staff must be given adequate instruction and training to prevent them causing unnecessary noise when they leave the premises.

iii) Noise Control Measures

All external doors and windows must be kept closed, other than for access and egress, in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place

iv) Noise Control Measures

The premises License holder shall take all necessary steps to ensure that noise or vibration is not noticeable inside or at the façade of any noise sensitive premises.

v) Noise Control Measures

The holder of the premises licence or responsible person shall ensure that no noise shall emanate from the Licensed Premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance or unreasonable disturbance to the occupiers of premises in the vicinity of the Licensed Premises.

vi) Noise Control Measures

Any request by an authorised officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels shall be complied with.

vii) Noise Control Measures

The placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premise shall take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.

viii) Odour Control Measures

All ventilation of steam and cooking fumes to the atmosphere shall be suitably filtered to avoid nuisance from smell, grease or smoke to persons in neighbouring or nearby properties.

ix) Noise Control Measures

Speakers should be located away from the noise sensitive premises, avoiding locations close to the joining wall.

9. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 9.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as 'the Council') is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for the variation of a premises licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act.
- 9.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 28th October 2011.
- 9.3 The application before this committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Licensing committee will make its decision based upon:
 - The merits of the application
 - The promotion of the four licensing objectives
 - The statement of policy of the Licensing Authority
 - The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport March 2010 under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 9.4 The licensing authority may determine the application, depending upon what is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in any of the following ways:
 - · decide to grant or vary the licence in the same terms as it was applied for
 - decide to grant or vary the licence, but to modify or add conditions (to promote the licensing objectives);
 - exclude from the scope of the licence a licensable activity
 - decide to refuse to vary the licence

9.5 Conditions are modified if they are altered, omitted or any new condition added (Section 35(4) Licensing Act 2003.

LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Interested parties':

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association.
- a member of the relevant licensing authority e.g. a Councillor

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public

- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

Or the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;

- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003

'Vicinity': Given the normal everyday meaning of being 'near to' when considering the relevance of representations received from individual's residence or business.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when

(a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or(b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children–

Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

Provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on–

The outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

The likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or

flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark

7. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures–

- (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Crime and Disorder

- 8. No customers will be admitted, or permitted to leave when carrying open bottles or glasses.
- 9. The consumption of alcohol is restricted to the areas identified on the plan attached to the operating schedule.
- 10. The maximum occupancy of the licensed premises is restricted at any one time to: 50
- 11. Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink under the authority of a personal licence holder must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to suspect that the individual may be under 18 years of age.
- 12. The premises license holder shall be responsible for prevention and disposal of waste on the frontage of the premises and make provision for the emptying of litter bins in the vicinity of the premises.

Public Safety

- 13. Escape routes and exits, including external exits, shall be maintained to ensure that they are not obstructed, in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.
- 14. Where chairs and tables are provided, internal gangways are to be kept unobstructed.
- 15. All fire doors shall be maintained as effectively self-closing and not held open other than by approved devices (for example, electromagnetic releases operated by smoke detectors).
- 16. Safety checks are to be carried out before the admission of the public or club members and guests; and details of such checks are to be kept in a Log-book.
- 17. Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations shall be arranged so as not to obstruct exits, fire safety signs or fire-fighting equipment.
- 18. The fire brigade will be called at once on actuation of the fire alarm or to any outbreak of fire, however slight, and the details recorded in a Fire Log-book.
- 19. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.

20. The following systems shall be maintained and inspected by suitably qualified professional persons in accordance with any British Standards and at intervals recommended in national guidance, and records kept of such inspections available for inspection by authorised officers on request:

Building Electrical Installation Fire Warning System Suspended ceilings Portable fire fighting equipment

Public Nuisance

- 21. The premises license holder shall take all necessary steps to ensure that noise or vibration is not noticeable at the façade of any noise sensitive premises.
- 22. Prominent, clear and legible notices at all exits shall be displayed on the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 23. The placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premises shall take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- 24. The playing of live or recorded music in garden areas of the premises after shall not be permitted.
- 25. Any request by an authorised officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels shall be complied with.
- 26. The outside area will be closed by 21.00 everyday
- 27. Receptacles for waste shall be emptied regularly to minimise nuisance smells.
- 28. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the licensed premises must not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, {whilst balancing the need for lighting in the interests of prevention of crime and disorder}.
- 29. Receptacles for refuse storage shall be maintained in a clean condition.

Protection of Children from Harm

30. Children under the age of 12 require to be accompanied by adults after 8 pm in the evening.

On 22nd November 2011 Cambridgeshire Constabulary received notification from the regulatory Officers at Peterborough County Council of an application for a new premises license for a venue called 'Paradise' at 83 Eastfield News, Peterborough, PE1 4AS. A duplicate copy of that license application, and consent of designated premises supervisor, namely Farley De Passos has also been received by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

I understand that the applicant wishes to apply for a new premises license for a coffee shop / cafeteria and supply, both on and off premises, alcohol daily between the hours of 07:00am and 01:00am. It is also understood that as part of this the applicant wishes to convert the vacant next door premises and intends to incorporate that premises into the current 'Paradise' café as one larger venue.

As the licensing Officer for Cambridgeshire Constabulary I would like to make representation in relation to this request. The premises lies within a residential area whose residents have already made complaints to the local Neighborhood Policing Team about issues concerning excessive noise, alcohol related crime and antisocial behaviour. This unnecessary and unacceptable behaviour can be linked to the numerous alcohol retail premises along the short stretch of Eastfield Road which includes the current 'Paradise' venue. I believe the current license conditions are appropriate for this business to operate as a café / coffee shop. It is perceived that if the license was to be granted, extending alcohol licensing to 01:00am, then this will have a detrimental effect on the local residents. Local Police Officers are working in partnership with other agencies to reduce crime and disorder and improve the local area for the community. I truly believe that by maintaining the current license conditions the applicant will be showing his willingness to adhere to the principles of licensing and his obligation to reduce crime and disorder and in particularly not become a nuisance to the community. The current license authorises the sale of alcohol until 23:00pm.

Furthermore, I would like the applicant to seriously consider and adopt the following license conditions onto the license application. These conditions are deemed necessary in assisting and supporting the licensee and his staff and will prove to protect the licensee, staff, customers and property in line with the objectives of licensing:

- 1. Staff training in relation to identifying and preventing sales of alcohol to any person who is, or appears to be drunk should be undertaken on a monthly basis. This training, together with ongoing training to prevent underage sales, such as challenge 21 or challenge 25, should be recorded in a written format and be available to an authorised officer upon demand.
- 2. A personal licence holder shall be on the premises at all times they are open for the hours authorised on the premises licence for the sale of alcohol off the premises.
- 3. CCTV recording equipment and associated cameras will be maintained once a week and will record and store digital images for a period not less than 28 days. A record of maintenance is to be kept and made available to an authorised officer upon request. CCTV images are to be produced to an authorised officer upon request
- 4. CCTV cameras will be positioned so that they cover the front aspect / entrance of the property in addition to internal public rooms and the customer service area.
- 5. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.

Dear Sirs,

It came to my notice that a cafe named as Paradise at81a Eastfield Road, has applied for an alcohol licence during the week days between 12.00 and 23.30 and weekend until 01.30 and Sundays up to 23.30.

As a resident in the immediate area residing at Gloucester Place, off Monument Street, I must strongly object to the issue of such a licence, due to the already experienced issues with the same 'Cafe'.

I must point out that this establishment portrays itself as a cafe, but in reality is used in particular the Portuguese residents in the surrounding area. That in itself is not an issue at all, but in practise most of the frequenters are heavy smokers and are outside at the front of the same premises and are very loud indeed, particularly late at night causing my family and direct neighbours in Gloucester Place not having a restful night at all at frequent occasions. The mere fact that more than often under age children are seen at the place among a heavy drinking crowd seems to us not exactly what this community does want either. Noise at night travels far; we back on to the Eastfield cemetery and get the noise direct from these premises at the back and cannot sleep at times with windows open due to this noise.

Slamming doors and screeching tyres, together with loud music is not what brings piece to this neighbourhood and we implore you to keep the progress made in the last years in mind, since the old pub at the corner of Eastfield Road/Monument Street has turned successfully into a mini supermarket. Many shops have raised their game by installing new shop fronts and cleaned up their act. A potential alcoholics den and probable drug dealing place is the last thing we want to see developing

An even more serious issue is also at stake here, which is the local nuisance and upsets, caused by alcoholics that have entered this area in the last few months, seemingly going to this cafe to top up their spirit level, often starting in the morning well before the proposed 12.00 time. This is nothing more than disguising a cafe into a Pub and thus getting away with no regulations that otherwise would be in place. After all a few doors away there is already a pub present, which seems to follow the general rule to our experience so far.

Any addition to the alcohol already sold (for off premises) in this area is more than enough and will only enhance the vagrancy and alcoholics problem and put pressure on the councils resources.

I trust and hope that the council will make a common sense decision in curtailing the alcohol licence for use to sell only up to 10 PM and then for use on premises only, to avoid this going out of hand.

I look forward to future comments.
