1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine an application for the review of a Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 served by Cambridgeshire Constabulary in relation to the above premises. The review was brought under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 An application for a new premises licence made under the Licensing Act 2003 was made by Mr Halil and Mr Musa Demir on 28th August 2007 for Peterborough Snooker Centre. The licence was granted on 25th September 2007. On 12th December 2017 the premises licence was transferred to Mr Jawad Ismail who is the current licence holder as well as the current designated premises supervisor.
- 2.2 A copy of the current licence is attached at **Appendix B Page 9**

3. APPLICATION

- 3.1 In accordance with section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 following the submission of an application to review the premises licence from Cambridgeshire Constabulary, a Responsible Authority, the licensing authority must hold a hearing.
- 3.2 A copy of the application to review was received on 15 June 2023, a copy of this application is attached at **Appendix C Page 23**
- 3.3 A statutory 'Notice' was displayed on the premises in accordance with Part 5 no. 38 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 – The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005.
- 3.4 No other representations have been received from any of the remaining Responsible Authorities nor from 'other persons'.

4. SUMMARY OF ISSUES RAISED BY RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

- During February and March 2023, a bar person employed by Mr Ismail assisted in the dealing of drugs, namely cocaine, within the premises. This bar person was subsequently arrested, and the investigation is currently ongoing.
- During a meeting in June 2023 between Mr Ismail and Police and Peterborough City Council Licensing Officers, the bar person involved in the dealing of drugs entered the premises. Mr Ismail confirmed that this person was a long-standing friend and had not been excluded from the premises.
- There are concerns that Mr Ismail is not in control of the premises. It is felt that he did not take immediate positive action to mitigate further offences and is allowing criminal activity to take place. He does not appear to understand his responsibilities to uphold the licensing objectives.
- Section 11.28 of Guidance (issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003) recommends that revocation of the licence even in the first instance, should be seriously considered where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines, that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes.

6. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- 6.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a review of a premises licence following the application by Trading Standards (Responsible Authority) to review the premises licence made under section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 15 June 2023.
- 6.3 The application before this committee will consider
 - (i) The application to review the licence,
 - (ii) Any relevant representations
- 6.4 The committee will take such of the steps as it considers that action is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
 - (e) to revoke the licence

and for this purpose, the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added

6.5 In addition the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

'The licensing authority may decide that the review does not require it to take any further steps appropriate to promote the licensing objectives. In addition, there is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. It is expected that licensing authorities will regard such informal warnings as an important mechanism for ensuring that the licensing objectives are effectively promoted and that warnings should be in issued in writing to the licence holder. However, where responsible authorities such as the police or environmental health officers have already issued warnings requiring improvement – either orally or in writing – that have failed as part of their own stepped approach to concerns, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach and should take this in to account when considering what further action is appropriate.'

LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases, they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

(a) means an individual aged under 16.

(b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over.

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day-today responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late-Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public.
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises.
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Challenge 25' means that a retailer will ask for proof of identification if they have reason to believe that the person making a purchase of alcohol is under the age of 25.

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Lice Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013.

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days).
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time.
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when

(a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
(b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal

(b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (a) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(b) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i)Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii)Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(c) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(d) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(e) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(f) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

(i) a holographic mark or

(ii) an ultraviolet feature.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

7. **1.** A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

P = D + (DxV)

where---

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty

were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a

premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.—(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision (where supervisors are engaged this condition applies)

All door supervisors will be Security Industry Authority registered.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Crime and Disorder

- 9. Video/CCTV equipment shall be installed inside/outside the premises and maintained in working order.
- 10. Video/CCTV equipment will be set to record from the time that the premises open to the public until the premises close and all members of the public have left.
- 11. Digital images shall be retained for at least one month and shall be produced to an authorised officer on demand.
- 12. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted up so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.
- 13. No drinks shall be available for consumption from glass bottles.
- 14. No customers will be admitted, or permitted to leave when carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses.
- 15. The consumption of alcohol is restricted to the areas identified on the plan attached to the operating schedule.
- 16. The maximum occupancy of the licensed premises is restricted at any one time to:80
- 17. Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink under the authority of a personal licence holder must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to suspect that the individual may be under **21** years of age.
- 18. Any conditions of entry to the premises shall be displayed in the vicinity of any entrance to the premises.

Public Safety

- 19. Escape routes and exits, including external exits, shall be maintained to ensure that they are not obstructed, in good order with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.
- 20. Where chairs and tables are provided, internal gangways are to be kept unobstructed.
- 21. Doors at exits shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily.
- 22. All fire doors shall be maintained as effectively self-closing and not held open other than by approved devices.

- 23. Safety checks are to be carried out before the admission of the public or club members and guests; and details of such checks are to be kept in a Log-book. The same log book will be used to record alcohol refusals and incidents.
- 24. Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations shall be arranged so as not to obstruct exits, fire safety signs or fire-fighting equipment.
- 25. The fire brigade will be called at once on actuation of the fire alarm or to any outbreak of fire, however slight, and the details recorded in a Log-book.
- 26. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.

Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the 27. schedule shall be available for inspection by an authorised officer on request.

28. Where tables and chairs are provided, clear gangways to exits are maintained.

Public Nuisance

- 29. The premises license holder shall take all necessary steps to ensure that noise or vibration is not noticeable at the façade of any noise sensitive premises.
- 30. Approval from the Licensing Authority (by means of a variation application) shall be sought prior to the use of explosives, pyrotechnics and fireworks of a similar nature which could cause disturbance in surrounding areas.
- 31. The placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premises shall take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
- 32. Any request by an authorised officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels shall be complied with.
- 33. Adequate and suitable (lidded) receptacles shall be provided to receive and store refuse from the premises.
- 34. Receptacles for refuse storage shall be maintained in a clean condition.
- 35. Noise Control Measures

All external doors other than for access and egress, and windows opening onto Alma Road must be kept closed, in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

36. Noise Control Measures

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.

37. Noise Control Measures

All music noise and amplified music or speech emitted from the premises shall not be audible inside noise sensitive premises between 23:00 hrs and 07:00 hrs.

38. Noise Control Measures

Deliveries and collections (including refuse collections) should not take place before 7 am or after 7pm.

39. Litter

Litter shall be prevented at all times and where identified, regularly cleared from the vicinity of the premises. Litter includes cigarette ends and a suitable receptacle shall be provided at access and egress points of the premises.

Protection of Children from Harm

40. Children under the age of 16 require to be accompanied by adults after 11pm in the evening.



During the months of February and March 2023 a Bar Person working for Mr ISMAIL has assisted or participated in the dealing of drugs namely cocaine within the premises (Peterborough Snooker Club). The person has subsequently been arrested on 31st May 23 and the investigation is currently ongoing.

On Tuesday 6th June 2023 at 14:00 hours PC 2094 HAWKINS and Mr D DOLBY (PCC Licensing) held a meeting with Mr ISMAIL. Mr ISMAIL disclosed that he was aware that an employee had been arrested on suspicion of supplying Drugs (CLASS A) and that the premises had been searched as a result. Mr ISMAIL then advised that the person had been dismissed from their role, however they had been friends for approximately 20 years and was still allowed in as a patron. Whilst speaking with Mr ISMAIL a person entered via the rear door, Mr ISMAIL explained that it was the person that had been arrested for the drug related offence, both DOLBY and I advised that the person should leave immediately, and we did not engage with them.

There are concerns that the Mr ISMAIL is not in control of the premises, did not take immediate positive action to mitigate further offences and is allowing criminal activity, to take place and he does not appear to understand his responsibilities to uphold the licensing objectives.

Should the Committee decide that to Revoke or Suspend the Licence is not appropriate, Cambridgeshire Constabulary respectfully requests that the Licensing committee considers the removal of the DPS Mr ISMAIL and for additional conditions to be added to the licence. Suggested additions:

- 1. 100% searching of patrons and staff.
- 2. 100% ID checking and the use of an ID Scanner.
- 3. SIA Security when licensable activities are taking place.
- 4. Personal Licence Holder to be present, at all times Licensable Activities are taking place.
- 5. Over 18-year-olds only.
- 6. Staff training to include Drugs and CSE

11.24 "....Licensing authorities do not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. This is a matter for the courts. The licensing authority's role when determining such a review is not therefore to establish the guilt or innocence of any individual but to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective."

11.28 "It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered."
