1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine this application for a <u>new</u> premises licence for Eastfield Off Licence, 298 Eastfield Road, Eastfield, Peterborough, PE1 4RA taking into account the representation against the application that has been received.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 This is a new application for a premises licence. There has not been any previous premises licence granted at this property.

3. AUTHORISATIONS AND TIMES APPLIED FOR (Amended after mediation)

Sale of alcohol on the premises

Monday to Sunday 09:00 to 23:00

4. APPLICATION

- 4.1 Please refer to the application attached at **Appendix B Page 11**
- 4.2 Representations against the application being granted have been received from 1 local resident on behalf of the Broadway Residents Association in their capacity of 'other persons'. This representation is attached at **Appendix C on Page 29**.
- 4.3 Part P of the application sets out the applicant's proposed conditions under the licensing objectives, these being, 'The Prevention of Public Nuisance', 'Public Safety', 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' and 'The Protection of Children from Harm'. These are also contained within the body of this report (in section 7) and in accordance with section 10.5 of Guidance

have been interpreted into enforceable conditions. Only those appropriate and proportionate for the promotion of the licensing objectives have been included in the Operating Schedule.

- 4.5 No representations have been received from any of the Responsible Authorities; Cambridgeshire Constabulary, Peterborough Trading Standards, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council Planning Department, Peterborough City Council Health & Safety Department, Peterborough City Council Environmental Pollution Team, Public Health or Children's Services.
- 4.6 A 'Notice' was displayed in the newspaper in accordance with Part 4 No. 25 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005.

5. REPRESENTATIONS

- 5.1 Summary of issues raised in the representation against the application being granted:
 - The granting of the licence would increase late night noise in the vicinity of the premises to the detriment of local residents.
 - The granting of the licence would increase anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of Eastfield Road.
 - It is inappropriate to sell alcohol very close to an educational establishment (Peterborough College).
- 5.2 Members should note that the correspondence attached against the application are in their entirety. Please note that not all matters raised within the representations are relevant matters for consideration under the Licensing Act 2003. It is up to the Committee to decide upon what 'weight' they attach to these areas.

6. MEDIATION

6.1 No mediation took place.

7. APPLICANT'S PROPOSED CONDITIONS UNDER THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES:

7.1 Crime and disorder

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 31 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises when they are open to the public and must be able to produce/download/ burn CCTV images upon reasonable & lawful request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority or, if not present, the conversant member of staff shall produce the footage as described within 24 hours of a reasonable & lawful request. Any footage must be in a format that can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (i.e., compact disc, flash card etc), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.

The premises licence holder will ensure that a digital CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.ico.org.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.

The premises licence holder shall ensure, by the completion of a written risk assessment, that the provision of SIA door supervisors at the premises is appropriate to ensure the safe control of the premises, and shall review this on a regular basis and upon request from the Police and/or the Licensing Authority.

A record (Including name, SIA Badge number, Contact details) of the SIA Door Supervisors employed shall be kept for a period of 12 months and be made immediately available upon request of a Responsible Authority.

Documented written / online records of training shall be completed and kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority. Training shall include (but not exclusively):

- a) Responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003
- b) Relevant Age restriction in respect of alcohol sales ie. Challenge 25,
- c) Recognising signs of drunkenness, refusing service

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol ('DPS Authorisation List' or similar). The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to verify their identity against the notice.

A refusals record will be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record will include the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member or volunteer who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. All entries will be made within 24 hours of the refusal. The record will be made available for inspection upon request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

An incident Record will be kept at the premises which details all incidents of concern that occur on the premises. This record will include the date and time of the incident, a description of the incident & customer, the name of the staff member or volunteer dealt with the matter, Police reference Number if reported. All entries will be made within 24 hours of the incident. The record will be made available for inspection upon request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

The premises licence holder and/or designated premises supervisor shall ensure that any outside area included in the licence will be controlled in a safe and effective manner to the same standard operated within the premises building and will pay special attention to the impact that the use of the outside area has on the surrounding community

No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders, perry's or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises

There shall be no availability / sell of miniature spirits, or individual vessels / containers of Beers/larger/cider/perry's.

No alcoholic drinks will be purchased by the store owners or staff from sellers calling at the store.

All sealed containers of alcoholic drinks offered for sale for consumption off the premises must be clearly labelled or marked with the name and postcode of the premises.

7.2 **Public Safety**

A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorised officer

Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the schedule will be displayed at the venue and made available for inspection by an authorised Local Authority or Police Officer on request

7.3 **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that noise caused by persons using, arriving at or departing from the premises shall not cause nuisance or unreasonable disturbance to the occupiers of residential properties.

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that no music or amplified speech originating from the premises shall be audible inside any residential property at any time. Note: For the purposes of this condition noise may be considered inaudible when it is at a low enough level that it is not recognisable as emanating from the source in question and/or it does not alter the perception of the ambient noise environment that would prevail in the absence of the source in question.

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits and in outdoor areas requesting customers and staff to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly

No deliveries may be made to the premises between 21.00 and 06.00 hours

Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient capacity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.

7.4 Protection of Children

The 'Challenge 25' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises & signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operate the 'Challenge 25' initiative.

9. LICENSING OFFICER'S COMMENT (FOR INFORMATION)

9.1 Regulation 19(a) requires authorities to disregard any information given by a party or person that is "not relevant" to the application.

10. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

10.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a new licence made under Section 17 of the Licensing Act.

- 10.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 30 August 2023.
- 10.3 The application before this Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Licensing committee will make its decision based upon:
 - The merits of the application;
 - The promotion of the four licensing objectives;
 - The statement of policy of the Licensing Authority; and
 - The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 – April 2018.
- 10.4 The licensing authority may determine the application, depending upon what is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in any of the following ways:
 - Decide to grant the licence in the same terms as it was applied for;
 - Decide to grant the licence, but to modify or add conditions (to promote the licensing objectives);
 - Exclude from the scope of the licence a licensable activity; and
 - Decide to refuse to grant the licence.
- 10.5 Conditions are modified if they are altered, omitted or any new condition added (Section 35(4) Licensing Act 2003.

APPENDIX A LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases, they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late-Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public.
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises.
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Challenge 25' means that a retailer will ask for proof of identification if they have reason to believe that the person making a purchase of alcohol is under the age of 25.

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Live Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days);
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

b) The prevention of crime and disorder
The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of 31 days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises when they are open to the public and must be able to produce/download/ burn CCTV images upon reasonable & lawful request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority or, if not present, the conversant member of staff shall produce the footage as described within 24 hours of a reasonable & lawful request. Any footage must be in a format that can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (ie. compact disc, flash card etc), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.
The premises licence holder will ensure that a digital CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the
Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.ico.org.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
The premises licence holder shall ensure, by the completion of a written risk assessment, that the provision of SIA door supervisors at the premises is appropriate to ensure the safe control of the premises, and shall review this on a regular basis and upon request from the Police and/or the Licensing Authority.
A record (Including name, SIA Badge number, Contact details) of the SIA Door Supervisors employed shall be kept for a period of 12 months and be made immediately available upon request of a Responsible Authority.
Documented written / online records of training shall be completed and kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at no greater than 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority. Training shall include (but not exclusively):
a) Responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003
b) Relevant Age restriction in respect of alcohol sales ie. Challenge 25,
c) Recognising signs of drunkenness, refusing service
The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that a written notice of authority is kept at the premises for all staff who sell alcohol ('DPS Authorisation List' or similar). The notice shall be made available for inspection upon request of the police or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and all staff selling alcohol must be in possession of formal identification to verify their identity against the notice.

A refusals record will be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record will include the date and time of the incident, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member or volunteer who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. All entries will be made within 24 hours of the refusal. The record will be made available for inspection upon request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

An incident Record will be kept at the premises which details all incidents of concern that occur on the premises. This record will include the date and time of the incident, a description of the incident & customer, the name of the staff member or volunteer dealt with the matter, Police reference Number if reported. All entries will be made within 24 hours of the incident. The record will be made available for inspection upon request by an officer of a Responsible Authority.

The premises licence holder and/or designated premises supervisor shall ensure that any outside area included in the licence will be controlled in a safe and effective manner to the same standard operated within the premises building and will pay special attention to the impact that the use of the outside area has on the surrounding community

No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders, perry's or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises

There shall be no availability / sell of miniature spirits, or individual vessels / containers of Beers/larger/cider/perry's.

No alcoholic drinks will be purchased by the store owners or staff from sellers calling at the store.

All sealed containers of alcoholic drinks offered for sale for consumption off the premises must be clearly labelled or marked with the name and postcode of the premises.

c) Public safety

A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorised officer

Valid public liability insurance shall be kept in force and a copy of the schedule will be displayed at the venue and made available for inspection by an authorised Local Authority or Police Officer on request

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that noise caused by persons using, arriving at or departing from the premises shall not cause nuisance or unreasonable disturbance to the occupiers of residential properties

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that no music or amplified speech originating from the premises shall be audible inside any residential property at any time. Note: For the purposes of this condition noise may be considered

inaudible when it is at a low enough level that it is not recognisable as emanating from the source in question and/or it does not alter the perception of the ambient noise environment that would prevail in the absence of the source in question.

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits and in outdoor areas requesting customers and staff to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly

No deliveries may be made to the premises between 21.00 and 06.00 hours

Litter bins shall be provided at the premises in sufficient capacity to ensure that customers can adequately dispose of any litter.

e) The protection of children from harm

The 'Challenge 25' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises & signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operate the 'Challenge 25' initiative.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.

- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but

There are already multiple off licences in the Eastfield Road area and another would add to the alcohol-related crime, disorder and public nuisance that is associated with these establishments. It is also inappropriate to promote alcohol sales very close to local educational establishments.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Alcohol-related crime and disorder are common in the Eastfield Road area with street drinking, abuse and threatening behaviour towards pedestrians and residents, and vandalism to private and public property by individuals under the influence of alcohol. Much of the alcohol is purchased from the multitude of existing off licences in the area. We do not need another to add to the problems.

Prevention of public nuisance

The area around 298 Eastfield Road is primarily residential and an off licence selling alcohol between 09.00 and 23.00, seven days a week, will attract drinkers who will generate noise and more alcohol fuelled disturbance throughout the day and late into the evening. They will also add to current litter problems in the area from discarded alcoholic drink containers

The protection of children from harm

The premises is very close to the entrance to the Peterborough College which has many teenage students under the legal age for purchase of alcohol. It would be inappropriate to allow an establishment to promote alcohol use at the entrance to such an educational establishment.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider and determine this application for a review of the personal licence for Alan Price whose home address is given as 54 Shirley Road, Southampton, SO15 3EX taking into account the information that has been received.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 Mr Price applied for a personal licence in March 2017 in the name of Raymond Alan Rayner. The documents supplied with the personal licence application included a criminal record subject access report. This report, dated 7th February 2007 indicated that there was no information held on the Police National Computer relating to Mr Price. In February 2009 there was a request for a change of name by deed poll to Alan Wilkinson. In September a change of name by deed poll was requested by Alan Wilkinson to change his name to George Coulson. In March 2014 a request was received to revert back to Raymond Rayner before in May 2017 a request of a change of name to Alan Price was received. Alan Price is the current name of the licence holder.
- On 31 August 2023 a request was received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary for the review of Mr Prices's personal licence. This request was made as a result of Mr Prices's conviction at Southampton Crown Court on 25 August 2023 for the offence of Sexual Assault Intentionally touch female No penetration contrary to Section 3 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003 and is a relevant offence in relation to the Licensing Act 2003. Cambridgeshire Constabulary's letter to review Mr Price's personal licence can be found at Appendix B, Page 35
- 2.3 Mr Price received a suspended 3 month custodial sentence wholly suspended for 15 months for the offence.
- 2.4 Mr Price did not notify the Licensing Authority of his conviction.

2.5 The Police have requested that the Committee consider suspending or revoking Mr A Prices's personal licence.

- 10.1 The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as "the Council) is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for a new licence made under Section 17 of the Licensing Act.
- 10.2 In this case, the application was received at these offices on 28 August 2023.
- 10.3 The application before this Committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Licensing committee will make its decision based upon:
 - The merits of the application;
 - The promotion of the four licensing objectives;
 - The statement of policy of the Licensing Authority; and
 - The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 December 2022.
- 10.4 The licensing authority may determine the application, depending upon what is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in any of the following ways:
 - Revoke or suspend the personal licence
 - Allow Mr Price to keep his personal licence

APPENDIX A LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

'Child'

- (a) means an individual aged under 16
- (b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

DCMS: Department for Culture Media and Sport

'Designated Premises Supervisor' means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

'Other Persons':

- persons who live, or are involved in a business, in the relevant licensing Authorities area and who are likely to be affected by the application and are not a Responsible Authority.

'Late Night Refreshment' means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

'Operating Schedule' means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

'Challenge 25' means that a retailer will ask for proof of identification if they have reason to believe that the person making a purchase of alcohol is under the age of 25.

'Rateable Value': as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Except where there is an exemption under the Live Music Act 2012 or Statutory Instrument 2013 No. 1578 The Licensing Act 2003 (Descriptions of Entertainment) (Amendment) Order 2013

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Primary Care Trust or Local Health Board (Director of Public Health)
- The Relevant Licensing Authority, Peterborough City Council
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

'Temporary Event Notice' means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 168 hours (7 days);
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 21 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003

After checking relevant police systems, I can confirm that Mr Alan PRICE was convicted at Southampton Crown Court on 25/08/2023 (Court Ref: 22/1304/69684E), receiving a suspended imprisonment of 3 months wholly suspended for 15 months.

Mr Alan PRICE who holds a Alcohol Personal Licence 049687 (copy attached) with Peterborough City Council, recently attended Southampton Crown Court in relation to allegation of SEXUAL ASSAULT -INTENTIONALLY TOUCH FEMALE - NO PENETRATION. The incident occurred on 07/07/22 on Licensed Premises

Sexual Assault by touching, contrary to section 3 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003, is a relevant offence under the Licensing Act 2003. Unfortunately, the courts did not deal with his Alcohol Personal Licence at the time.

Section 138 of the Policing and Crime Act 2017 amended the Licensing Act 2003 and gave licensing authorities the power to revoke or suspend personal licenses with effect from 6th April 2017. Cambridgeshire Constabulary respectfully requests that the licensing authorities consider the use of this power, and the process to revoke a personal licence as set out at section 132A of the Licensing Act 2003.
