Re: New Premises License Application – 86-88 Star Road, Peterborough.

On 10th November 2012 Cambridgeshire Constabulary received official correspondence in relation to a new Premises License application in respect of 86-88 Star Road, Peterborough, PE1 5HQ. A duplicate copy and notification was also received from the Licensing Officers at Peterborough City Council giving the application reference number 066073. Also attached was Part A – ‘Consent of individual to be specified as premises supervisor’, naming HAKAN TAS, of 316 LINCOLN ROAD, PETERBOROUGH, PE1 2ND as the designated premises supervisor.

The license applicant HAKAN TAS is a personal license holder No: LN/200712641 issued by Barnet London Borough Council. He wishes to apply for a premises license for the property located at 86-88 Star Road. This venue is intended to be a Grocery / Off-License premises and was formerly the ‘Eclipse Bookmakers’ betting shop. The applicant highlights within the premises license application that the venue intends to be open daily between the hours of 08:00am and 22:00pm and the Off-License sale of alcohol will take place daily between 10:00am and 22:00pm. No other specific licensable activities are asked for and there appears to be no variation from the standard timings and operation of the business.

As the licensing Officer for Cambridgeshire Constabulary I would like to make representation in relation to this application. A review will be deemed unnecessary if the licensee Mr. TAS would consider the following conditions and apply them to the Premises License with immediate effect.

1. When the venue is open outside of the licensable hours for the sale of alcohol all alcohol products will be secured away from public view.

Protection of Children from harm -

2. Staff training in relation to identifying and preventing sales of alcohol to any person who is, or appears to be drunk should be undertaken on a monthly basis. This training, together with ongoing training to prevent underage sales, such as challenge 21 or challenge 25, should be recorded in a written format and be available to an authorised officer upon demand.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder -

3. CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions in particular facial recognition. Cameras shall encompass all entrances and exits to the premises, fire exits and all area where the sale / supply of alcohol occurs.

4. CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped. Recordings must be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police on demand.
5. The Premises License Holder must ensure at all times a Designated Premises Supervisor or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format to the Police / Local Authority on demand.
6. The recording equipment and discs / usb pen drives shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.
7. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings of the system actions taken are to be recorded.
8. In the event of a technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises License Holder / Designated Premises Supervisor must report the failure to the Police or local authority immediately.
9. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises.
10. No customers will be admitted, or permitted to leave with open vessels or bottles of alcohol.
11. The premises license holder will be responsible for prevention and disposal of waste immediately around the premises and make provision for the emptying of litter bins in the vicinity of the premises.

Crime Prevention / Public Nuisance –

12. No single vessel of beer, lager or cider of 568ml (1 pint) or under, to be offered for sale.
13. Beer, lager or cider with a measurement of 568ml or under, can be sold with a minimum purchase of 2 vessels.
14. No beer, lager or cider beverage above 6.5% abv to be displayed or offered for sale.

Public Safety –

15. Lighting shall be provided outside the premises during the hours of darkness when any licensable activity takes place on the premises.

These additional conditions are deemed necessary to effectively protect the licensee, staff, customers and property from any negative issues which may impact upon principles of licensing.
