Peterborough City Council promises the children that we take into our care that we will...

- help encourage you to be healthy
- make sure you have health checks
- make sure your carer supports you to attend health checks
- make sure you are brought up in a supportive and safe environment
- make sure you are placed in safe and secure homes where you feel at home
- make sure you are treated equally, as one of the family

- give you written information about where you are going to live before you meet new carers
- avoid moving you to different placements
- keep brothers and sisters together if possible
- allow you to stay in touch with carers after 18 years old
- make sure you are able to have regular contact with relatives, if appropriate.
- support you to have a good education and recognise your hard work

- have events to celebrate your achievements
- make sure you are treated at school like any other pupil
- involve you in writing your education plan
- support you to learn and achieve your full potential
- make sure meetings do not take place during school time
- make sure you have access to a computer and other equipment you need
- support you into college and education
- support you to spend at least two hours a week taking part in activities you enjoy
- give you information about how to get an advocate

- give you information on how to get an independent visitor
- give you information on how to make a complaint or compliment
- make sure you have contact details for your social worker and reviewing officer
- involve you in your care plan
- make sure someone explains to you why you are in care
- help you to run the Children in Care Council so everyone has a chance to have their say
- support you to stay in care until you are at least 18 years old
- help you to get skills so you can care for yourselves when you are older
- make sure you have a bank account
- support you to follow your religion
