We are a national retailer that sells alcohol as part of a broad offering of goods and services. We have held off-licences in our stores for many years and are an approved British Institute of Inn-keeping examination centre. We have written training policies and formal training programmes are in place, which ensure our people are equipped to meet all licensing objectives. All training and revision/refresher materials are reviewed regularly. All stores currently comply with our 'Think 25' policy, this is brought to customer's attention through point of sale material within the store. We take legal compliance very seriously and in addition to local training we employ a central alcohol licensing compliance manager and have a compliance committee.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
The premises will have digital CCTV system that covers many areas of the shop floor, including the proposed area which will be used for beer and wine, should we be successful with our application. Images will be retained for a minimum of 21 days and made available on enforcement request. Ordinarily, a member of the Management team will be on the premises all the time the store is open. A person will have responsibility for the premises whilst the premises are open.
c) Public safety
A person will have responsibility for the premises whilst the premises are open. Management will be trained to support the running of the premises including looking after our customers and staff. The store will adhere to all rules and regulations relating to public safety.
d) The prevention of public nuisance
We intend to be an active member of the community. We welcome the opportunity to liaise with Police and enforcement authorities should the need arise.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained and regularly refreshed in the corporate 'Think 25' Policy. Staff will be trained to look at the customer and 'Think 25' when selling alcohol.

A till prompt will appear on the initial sale of alcohol that will remind the seller of their responsibilities including not to sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 18.

The store will display signage around the premises informing both staff and customers of our 'Think 25' policy on alcohol.

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PAYMENT DETAILS

If, however, the licence also authorises the use of the premises for the supply of alcohol or the provision of late night refreshment, a fee will be required.

Schools and sixth form colleges are exempt from the fees associated with the authorisation of regulated entertainment where the entertainment is provided by and at the school or college and for the purposes of the school or college.

Hello

I am writing to request the license for the above application not to be granted.

As a local councillor I have worked with local residents, council officers and the police to change the area in and around the proposed license store to eradicate significant street drinking and alcohol abuse. We have made significant progress in this area and their is a visible difference in the area. With one of the groups residing within yards of this proposed store and we have managed to dissolve the issue.

The prevention of crime and disorder

After a significant amount of time removing alcohol related disorder and crime in this very specific area. The people responsible for these types of issues remain in the same street and close by to this store. To open another establishment will firstly send the wrong message but more importantly it

would help to reverse all the gains we have made. We have put a strong message out regards Alcohol related disorder and acted decisively to make a difference and another store with cheap alcohol will undoubtedly be a step in the wrong direction. Police have been called to the direct area of the store to deal with significant crime and disorder within 100 yards of this store.

It will be in the benefit of the store not to sell alcohol and will minimise the issues they will undoubtedly be bringing on themselves. This disorder will be close to and in the same cul de sac as a school and children's centre which is a real concern for me as children will be passing this store from

early in the morning to early evening. The store is proposing to open from 6 am to 11pm which will be a magnet and incentive for street drinkers and disturbances will happen to very late and night and the feedback from drinkers is they seem to like the idea of a 6 am local store who will sell

cheap alcohol. This tells me the likelihood of crime and disorder are very high. This is a quiet residential area now and the license will create pressures that can and should be avoided.

Public Safety

The area and the road which the store is located is right next to a church and school and with the anticipated re-emergence of the street drinking this store will create their is a real and concerned opinion that safety of children and parents as they pass the drinking community. There has already

and continues to be violent related incidents in the area, this has diminished through work done by the police and council to dispute this problem. The probability in my experience with the problem that this store will encourage and create an area of drunken disorder causing real public safety concerns. We have had in the past violent altercations in the area due to problems with the street drinking community to the point there was serious police intervention on a number of times due to violence. This will be a probable outcome again if we allow alchol to be sold from these premises.

Protection of children from harm

This store will sell alchol directly outside a primary school, nursery and children's centre. Parents and children will be passing by this store all day and with the known problem in the area of street drinking and the related issues that go along with this issue there is a real probability of children

being exposed too and being unwilling drawn into the associated problems. From my experience dealing with this issue I can almost without uncertainty guarantee that children will be affected by the disorder cheap alcohol in this specific area will bring. The school and children's environment should not be compromised or threatened by the selling of alcohol and the knock on effect of encouraging street drinking.

The prevention of public disorder

Another store selling alcohol will escalate and send the wrong message to street drinkers which will increase public nuisance and affect local residents. The previous use of the site was a public house and the drinking was managed and in reality it was a discouragement for street drinking and public nuisance due to the fact the landlords managed the situation and most importantly the drinking was done in the building not outside. The premises are in a cul de sac, residential and close by a school. Next door to the store is a church who have grave concerns over the possibility of alcohol sales and the impact it will have on their congregation. There is also a remembrance garden used by family members to mourn their loved ones. This area has and may well again be a magnet to people wanting to consume their recently purchased alcohol. Overwhelmingly the local groups, residents and businesses are concerned for the level of public order which I and they believe will be compromised. Street drinking will become a real problem again in this area if the license is approved and this will lead to serious disorder on a regular basis. This will take us back two years, after a

significant effort by a number of organisations who due to financial constraints may not be repeatable.

If you are minded to approve the license could I ask for consideration on when alcohol is sold and ensure it does not happen during school times and ensure the street drinkers cannot buy alcohol early in the morning and late at night.

Also, as other city's do could you consider the ability to restrict the sale of cheap alcohol as instructed by other authorities such as Northampton Council.

Woodston a place where quality of life and community are the main catalyst for all decisions.

Dear Sir/ madam

I am writing to you with regards to the application for a licence to sell alcohol on the premises by the above company. As a resident of Woodston I am requesting that the license is not granted to Tesco Stores Ltd for the following reasons:

1) The prevention of crime and disorder

I believe granting a license to sell alcohol in this residential area near a school could bring street drinking to our area. Our local councillor has been working closely with the police to stop this in our area and another alcohol outlet will reverse the gains that have been made. With street drinking there is a greater risk of crime and disorder. There have been a number of incidents in this direct area where police have had to intervene due to alcohol related incidents, which if this license is granted, will create real and significant rises in crime and disorder by reversing all the gains that have been made over the last couple of years.

2) Public safety

Granting a license to Tesco Express which is located next to 2 primary schools and a nursery is a real concern to me. If people are buying alcohol from this shop and street drinking, the parents and children would not feel safe going to and leaving schools and nursery. With street drinking usually comes public disorder and maybe even violence. There has been violent, drink related problems in the area where people have felt physically threatened or have been the victim of violence. There has been a lot of good work to remove this problem and if this license is granted this work would be put into reverse.

3) The protection of children from harm

This retail business is in a vicinity very close to 2 primary schools and a nursery. The parents and children have to pass by this shop to go to and from the primary schools and nursery. If alcohol is sold here, street drinking will occur as it has happened in the past next to the other two shops which already have a license. Residents feel that if you grant this shop a license to sell alcohol you would be putting our children at risk as with street drinking usually comes public disorder and maybe even violence directly next to a primary school. The school environment should not be compromised by alcohol related problems and this application is directly next to a school.

4) The prevention of public nuisance

There are already 2 shops close by which sell alcohol. Street drinking has been a problem in this area for quite some time. If another shop is allowed to sell alcohol the street drinking issue will escalate and with that comes a public nuisance. This would be in a residential area near schools and a nursery. The shop is planning to open until 11pm at night, this would not be fair on the residents who live close by. If the shop sells alcohol it will attract people who will create more noise and disturbance to the residents. The premises was previously used as a public house, the street drinking was not its role and in fact it discouraged street drinking, this license will encourage street drinking in an area next to a school and where there are already a number of outlets selling alcohol.
