Maureen Baker (RCGP President) called this “the most significant announcement for general practice since the 1960s.”	
CHAPTER 1: £	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Investing a further <b>£2.4 billion by 2020/21</b> into general practice services.</li> <li>This means that investment will rise from <b>£9.6 billion a year in 2015/16</b> to over <b>£12 billion a year by 2020/21</b>.</li> <li>This includes recurrent and transformational funding</li> <li>Additionally a review on Carr-Hill formula in progress to ensure it reflects derivation and workload etc</li> </ul>
CHAPTER 2: WORKFORCE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create an extra <b>5,000 additional doctors working in general practice by 2020</b></li> <li>Attract an extra 500 GPs from abroad and targeted <b>£20,000</b> bursaries that have found it hardest to recruit.</li> <li><b>A minimum of 5,000 other staff working in general practice by 2020/21</b></li> <li>❖ <i>3,000 mental health therapists</i></li> <li>❖ <i>1,500 pharmacists</i></li> <li>• <b>£206 million in support for the workforce through:</b></li> <li>❖ <i>£112 million (in addition to £31m already committed) for the clinical pharmacist programme to enable a pharmacist per 30,000 population</i></li> <li>❖ <i>£15 million national investment for nurse development support including improving training capacity in general practice, increases in the number of pre-registration nurse placements and measures to improve retention of the existing nursing workforce and support for return to work.</i></li> <li>❖ <i>£45 million benefitting every practice to support the training of current reception and clerical staff to play a greater role in navigation.</i></li> <li>❖ <i>Investment by HEE in the training of 1,000 physician associates to support general practice. Introduction of pilots of new medical assistant roles that help support doctors.</i></li> <li>❖ <i>£6 million investment in practice manager development, alongside access for practice managers to the new national development programme.</i></li> </ul>
CHAPTER 3: WORKLOAD	<p><b>Support for GPs to manage demand, unnecessary work, bureaucracy and integration with wider system</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>£16 million extra investment</b> in specialist mental health services to support GPs with burn out and stress.</li> <li><b>£30 million</b> ‘Releasing Time for Patients’ development programme,</li> <li>new standard contract measures for hospitals to stop work</li> <li>new four year <b>£40 million</b> practice resilience programme (plus an <b>additional £16m in 2016/17</b>)</li> <li>move to five yearly CQC inspections for good/outstanding practices</li> <li>introduction of a simplified system across NHS E, CQC and GMC, streamlining of payment for practices, &amp; automation of common tasks.</li> </ul>
CHAPTER 4: INFRA- STRUCTURE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>£900m for premises and IT</b> (this is the continuation of the Primary Care Transformation Fund, now renamed)</li> <li><b>£45m</b> for e-consultation support</li> <li>New rules to allow up to <b>100% reimbursement of premises developments</b></li> <li>Over <b>18% increase in allocations</b> to CCGs for provision of IT services and technology for general practice</li> </ul>
CHAPTER 5: CARE REDESIGN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Support to strengthen &amp; redesign general practice</b> by commissioning and funding of services to provide extra primary care capacity across every part of England, backed by over <b>£500 million of funding by 2020/21</b> incl. <b>£171 million one-off investment</b> by CCGs starting in 2017/18, for practice transformational support, introduction of a new voluntary Multi-speciality Community Provider contract from April 2017.</li> <li><b>New national three year ‘Releasing Time for Patients’ programme to reach every practice in the country to free up to 10 percent of GPs’ time (£30m)</b>, building on recent NHS England and BMA roadshows.</li> </ul>
