#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

**1.1** To consider and determine this application for a variation to the premises licence for Somerfield, Paston Parkway, Peterborough, PE1 4SA taking into account the representations received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary and interested parties.

#### 2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On 29 July 2005 an application was made to Peterborough City Council by Somerfield Stores Ltd to convert and vary an existing Justices Off Licence to a premises licence under Schedule 8 to the Licensing act 2003. Representations were received with regard to the variation and a committee hearing determined the application on 22 September 2005. Although the application did not request 24 hour alcohol sales, the Committee decided to restrict alcohol sales Monday to Saturday from 08.00 to 23.00 Sunday 10.00 to 22.30, Christmas Day 12.00 to 15.00 and 19.00 to 22.30, Good Friday 08.00 to 22.30. All other activities were authorised including 24 hour operation of the premises. The Committee imposed 3 further conditions in addition to the conditions offered by the applicant. These conditions were:
  - The doors of the premises are to be locked at 23.00 and re-opened at 05.00 with all late night refreshments and other purchases to be sold for consumption off the premises through the night pay window.
  - Receptacles for refuse storage to be placed on the forecourt and emptied on a regular basis and;
  - Prominent clear legible notices at the exits shall be displayed on the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to deposit their litter in the receptacles provided.

- **2.2** On 12 January 2006, following an appeal by Somerfield the Magistrates Court ordered the following:
  - To extend the hours for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises by one hour on Sunday's from 09.00 to 23.00 on Sunday. But upheld the committee decision for the sale of alcohol on Monday to Saturday i.e. 08.00 to 23.00.
  - To grant the application as applied for in all other respects including the provision of late night refreshment between the hours of 23.00 to 05.00 Monday to Sunday
  - To remove the condition imposed by the committee requiring the premises to lock the doors and use a serving hatch.
- **2.3** Between 13 November 2006 and 31 October 2008 three variations to Designated Premises Supervisors have been received and granted.
- 2.4 A copy of the current licence which shows the current authorisations, timings and conditions is attached at **Appendix 2 Page 8**

#### 3. SUMMARY OF VARIATION APPLIED FOR

**3.1** To extend the hours for the sale of alcohol to 24 hours each day.

#### 4. APPLICATION

- **4.2** Representations have been received from Cambridgeshire Constabulary as a Responsible Authority under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and The Prevention of Public Nuisance objectives. A copy of the representation is attached at **Appendix 4 Page 27**
- **4.3** Representations have also been received from local residents, their representative bodies and a Ward Councillor. Members are required, when considering these representations to decide whether or not they are being made by or on behalf of 'interested parties' in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003. In order for a person to be an interested party in these circumstances they must live in the vicinity of the premises concerned. Vicinity is not defined by the Act, the associated Guidance or the Council's Licensing Policy and therefore is a matter for determination in the particular circumstances of each case. A plan indicating the location of the persons seeking to make representations in relation to the application is attached at **Appendix 5 Page 29**
- **4.4** No representations have been received from any of the other Responsible Authorities i.e. Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, Peterborough City Council Planning Department, Peterborough City Council Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council Child Protection, Peterborough City Council Trading Standards and Peterborough City Council Environmental Pollution Team.
- **4.5** A copy of the 'Notice' that was advertised in the newspaper in accordance with Part 4 no. 25 of Statutory Instruments 2005 No. 42 The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises licences and Club premises certificates) Regulations 2005 is attached at **Appendix 6 Page 30**
- **4.6** The applicant has stated that no additional conditions have been identified from those already attached to the current premises licence **Appendix 2 Page 8**

#### 9. LEGAL OFFICER'S COMMENTS

- **9.1** The Licensing Authority (hereafter referred to as 'the Council') is charged with implementing the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. This is an application for the variation of a premises licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act.
- **9.2** In this case, the application was received at these offices on 10 October 2008. The period during which relevant representations were made ended on 8 November 2008.
- **9.3** The application before this committee will be treated on its own merits, and the Licensing committee will make its decision based upon:
  - The merits of the application
  - The promotion of the four licensing objectives
  - The statement of policy of the Licensing Authority
  - The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport on 28 June 2007 under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- **9.4** The licensing authority may determine the application, depending upon what is necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, in any of the following ways:
  - decide to grant or vary the licence in the same terms as it was applied for
  - decide to grant or vary the licence, but to modify or add conditions (to promote the licensing objectives);
  - exclude from the scope of the licence a licensable activity
  - decide to refuse to vary the licence
- **9.5** Conditions are modified if they are altered, omitted or any new condition added (Section 35(4) Licensing Act 2003.

#### LICENSING ACT 2003 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Note: In this document, the following definitions are included to provide an explanation of certain terms included in the Act. In some cases they are an abbreviation of what is stated in the Licensing Act 2003 or an interpretation of those terms. For a full definition of the terms used, the reader must refer to the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 'Child'

(a) means an individual aged under 16

(b) a child is unaccompanied if he is not in the company of an individual aged 18 years or over

**DCMS**: Department for Culture Media and Sport

**'Designated Premises Supervisor'** means the person (who must be a Personal Licence Holder), in the case of premises selling alcohol, who will normally have been given the day to day responsibility for running the premises by the holder of the Premises Licence or will be the Premises Licence holder.

#### 'Interested parties':

- a person living in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons living in that vicinity, e.g. a residents association;
- a person involved in a business in the vicinity of the premises in question;
- a body representing persons involved in such a business e.g. a trade association.

**'Late Night Refreshment'** means the supply of hot food or hot drink to members of the public (whether for consumption on or off the premises) between the hours of 11.00 pm and 5.00 am.

#### 'Licensable Activities' means: -

- The sale by retail of alcohol
- The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- The provision of Regulated Entertainment
- The provision of Late Night Refreshment

'Licensing Authority': - is the licensing function of Peterborough City Council

'Licensed Premises' includes club premises and events unless the context otherwise requires.

#### 'Licensing Objectives'

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

**'Operating Schedule'** means a document containing a statement of the following matters (and any others that may be prescribed): -

- The relevant Licensable Activities
- The times at which the Licensable Activities are to take place and any other times when premises are open to the public
- Information regarding the person who will be specified in the Premises Licence as the Premises Supervisor
- Where the Licensable Activities involve the supply of alcohol, whether it is for the supply on and/or off the premises
- The steps being taken to promote the Licensing Objectives

**'Rateable Value'**: as regards a premises, is the value for the time being in force for the premises entered in the local non-domestic rating list for the purposes of Part III of the Local Government Finance Act 1988(b).

'Regulated Entertainment' (Schedule 1 of the Act) means: -

- A performance of a play
- An exhibition of a film
- An indoor sporting event
- A boxing or wrestling entertainment
- A performance of live music
- Any playing of recorded music
- A performance of dance

Or entertainment of a similar description falling within the last three of the categories listed above, where the entertainment takes place in the presence of and for the purposes of entertaining that audience or spectators.

Or the provision of entertainment facilities:

Facilities for enabling persons to take part in entertainment of the following description for the purpose or purposes, which include the purpose of being entertained:

- making music
- dancing
- entertainment of a similar description

'Relevant Licensing Authority': is the Authority in the area the premises are situated.

'Responsible Authority' means any of the following: -

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary (The Chief Officer of Police)
- Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue (The Fire Authority)
- Health and Safety Team, Peterborough City Council
- Planning authority, Peterborough City Council
- Trading Standards, Peterborough City Council
- Environmental Health Pollution, Peterborough City Council
- Children's' Services Child Protection & Review Manager
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency, Walton on Naze. (For vessels carrying more than 12 passengers.)
- Environment Agency, Peterborough (For vessels carrying 12 or less passengers).

#### 'Supply of alcohol':

- the sale by retail of alcohol, or
- the supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

**'Temporary Event Notice'** means a Permitted Temporary Activity involving one or more Licensable Activities subject to the following various conditions and limitations: -

- Duration they are limited to events lasting for up to 96 hours;
- Scale they cannot involve the presence of more than 499 people at any one time;
- Use of the same premises the same premises cannot be used on more than 12 occasions in a calendar year, but are subject to the overall aggregate of 15 days irrespective of the number of occasions on which they have been used; and
- The number of notices given by an individual within a given period of time a Personal Licence Holder is limited to 50 notices in one year, and another person to 5 notices in a similar period.

(In any other circumstances, a full Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate will be required for the period of the event).

#### 'the Act': means the Licensing Act 2003

**'Vicinity'**: Given the normal everyday meaning of being 'near to' when considering the relevance of representations received from individual's residence or business.

## Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

## Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when

(a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

## **Crime and Disorder**

- 4. A CCTV system will be maintained which is fit for the purpose
- 5. The CCTV system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable manner for a reasonable period of time
- 6. The CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity
- 7. The precise position of the cameras may be agreed with police from time to time
- 8. Notices advising that CCTV has been installed on the premises shall be posted up so that they are clearly visible to the public within the licensed premises

## Public Safety

- 9. Management are responsible for ensuring that comprehensive arrangements exist to enable the safe evacuation of all occupants including disabled occupants in the event of an emergency.
- 10. All exit doors shall be easily openable and shall not require the use of a key, card, code or similar means,
- 11. Doors at exits shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check will be kept and shall be produced to an authorised officer on demand.
- 12. Notices detailing the action to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the fire brigade should be summoned, shall be prominently displayed and protected from damage and deterioration.
- 13. All fire exits and means of escape shall be signed in accordance with BS5499.

## Public Nuisance

- 14. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises
- 15. Prominent clear legible notices at the exits shall be displayed on the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to deposit their litter in the receptacles provided

## **Protection of Children from Harm**

- 16. Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to suspect that the individual may be under 18 years of age.
- 17. Retailer Alert Bulletins issued by the Portman Group shall be complied with.

#### Annex 2A – Embedded Restrictions

#### **Embedded Restrictions:**

Licensees should note that the under enclosed embedded restrictions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

#### **ALCOHOL 'OFF' LICENCES**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

(a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

(b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

(c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;

(d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises






Dear Licensing Team,

On 13<sup>th</sup> October 2008 we received an application for Somerfield Stores, Paston Parkway. The application proposed alcohol to be sold for consumption off the premises twenty four hours a day, seven days a week.

The Police Licensing Team and Neighbourhood Policing Sergeant and Inspector have considered this application and wish to make the following representation in order for the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance, and to uphold public safety, in and around the premises. The Neighbourhood Policing Inspector would like the premises to operate a sales hatch in order to supply customers with alcohol purchased at the shop between the hours of 23:00 and 06:00 daily. The premises have experienced ongoing problems with shoplifting, particularly of alcoholic beverages. It is felt by the Police that if alcohol is sold via a hatch, and not openly available inside the store, during the evening hours then incidents of shoplifting, and associated anti-social behaviour and public nuisance, will be prevented. The Neighbourhood Policing Inspector feels that if alcohol is not sold through the hatch, but is available for purchase in the store twenty four hours a day, there will be a significant rise in shoplifting offences at this premise. The Police would be happy to discuss this matter with representatives from Somerfield and support the safe operating of the premises. The Police Community Safety Unit and Neighbourhood Policing Team would like to offer crime prevention advice should Somerfield wish to seek further guidance regarding crime, disorder, personal safety or any other issues regarding the premises.
