### **RECOVERY ACTIVITY**

Interim recovery plan for child exploitation continues to be being actively worked and the good multi agency working to complete the actions has been maintained. The test and trace process for exploited young people is now being implemented.

Mapping of street based violence within Peterborough has been completed. The mapping concluded that all of the instances considered were linked with county lines activity and were targeted attacks. There was no evidence to support that the incidents considered were random violent attacks. A partnership safety plan around those young people who were involved in the mapping is in place.

Recovery plan for multi agency safeguarding training further developed and some multi agency safeguarding training via teams will commence the w/c 13<sup>th</sup> July.– in the interim we are still producing the virtual training" that people can access at any time . To date 1,689 people have accessed the virtual training that we have developed since lockdown.
