	Councillor Fitzgerald, Representative on the Combined Authority Board
	It is now over ten years since the new development at Manor Drive Paston was started and many hundreds of new homes have been built in that period. Significant sums of money in Section 106 contributions were paid to Peterborough City Council to provide a bus service for the development and bus stops and shelters were put in place but to date no bus service has been provided.
	Given that this is now a Combined Authority responsibility and they have the relevant funds, could our Representative on the board tell me what is being done to provide a bus service to Manor Drive as local people are getting fed up with waiting years for it and we assume that the developers would not be happy if they knew that the money has not been used for the purpose for which they were asked to provide it for.

## **COUNCIL MEETING 22 JUNE 2022**

#### AMENDMENT FROM COUNCILLOR HUSSAIN TO THE MOTION FROM COUNCILLOR JAMIL

Amendment to be moved as follows:

"Peterborough City Council is proud of its diversity and has, which is a huge asset and a source of great strength. A substantial proportion of its <u>Peterborough's</u> residents are Muslim, who are an integral part of its make-up, playing a huge role in all aspects of the <del>Peterborough</del> City's life.

Peterborough has a strong history of promoting cohesion and welcoming people from all over the world. Its residents have always united and supported each other in the fight against racism and discrimination in all its forms.

This Council <u>therefore opposes Islamophobia</u>. It notes that Paul Bristow MP is the Co-Chair <u>of welcomes</u>, endorses and adopts the working the APPG (All-Party Parliamentary Group) <u>on</u> <u>British Muslims</u>, which produced a working definition of Islamophobia <u>in 2018</u>. This definition, including all of its examples in full, <u>is</u> cited as follows:

"ISLAMOPHOBIA IS ROOTED IN RACISM AND IS A TYPE OF RACISM THAT TARGETS EXPRESSIONS OF MUSLIMNESS OR PERCEIVED MUSLIMNESS.

Contemporary examples of Islamophobia in public life, the media, schools, the workplace, and in encounters between religions and non-religions in the public sphere could, considering the overall

context, include, but are not limited to:

- Calling for, aiding, instigating or justifying the killing or harming of Muslims in the name of a racist/fascist ideology, or an extremist view of religion.
- Making mendacious, dehumanizing, demonizing, or stereotypical allegations about Muslims as such, or of Muslims as a collective group, such as, especially but not exclusively, conspiracies about Muslim entryism in politics, government or other societal institutions; the myth of Muslim identity having a unique propensity for terrorism and claims of a demographic 'threat' posed by Muslims or of a 'Muslim takeover'.
- Accusing Muslims as a group of being responsible for real or imagined wrongdoing committed by a single Muslim person or group of Muslim individuals, or even for acts committed by non-Muslims.
- Accusing Muslims as a group, or Muslim majority states, of inventing or exaggerating Islamophobia, ethnic cleansing or genocide perpetrated against Muslims.
- Accusing Muslim citizens of being more loyal to the 'Ummah (transnational Muslim community) or to their countries of origin, or to the alleged priorities of Muslims worldwide, than to the interests of their own nations.
- Denying Muslim populations, the right to self-determination e.g., by claiming that the existence of an independent Palestine or Kashmir is a terrorist endeavour.
- Applying double standards by requiring of Muslims behaviours that are not expected or demanded of any other groups in society, e.g. loyalty tests.
- Using the symbols and images associated with classic Islamophobia.

• Holding Muslims collectively responsible for the actions of any Muslim majority state, whether secular or constitutionally Islamic."

This Council asks the Chief Executive of the Council to: agrees that there is no place for discrimination against Muslims within Peterborough City Council, its contractors or Council-funded groups and RESOLVES to refer consideration of whether and how to adopt a definition of Islamophobia, including the appropriateness of the APPG definition and examples, to the Constitution & Ethics Committee for further consideration and to make recommendations back to Full Council.

As part of this consideration, officers should first write to our two local members of Parliament, seeking their views on the APPG's working definition of Islamophobia and the Government's progress towards a definition that could achieve the widest support, recognising that the National Police Chiefs Council (NPCC) regards the APPG's working definition of Islamophobia as "too broad to be effective" and as jeopardising "free speech".

- 1. and the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities asking them to listen to Muslim communities and the cross-party group of MPs and peers and to adopt this definition of Islamophobia which classifies discrimination against Muslims as a form of racism.
- 2. Continue to prioritise tackling hate crime and Islamophobia in partnership. Peterborough City Council works with partners such as Cambridgeshire Police, on a rolling basis, and will now coordinate future actions in line with this definition of Islamophobia for all Muslims."
