RECOMMENDATIONS

The Cabinet Member is recommended to:

- 1. Authorise the award of works to Milestone Infrastructure Limited, utilising the existing Peterborough Highways Term Service Contract, to complete the following projects:
  - \* APV Baker Bridge repairs, works not exceeding a value of £750,000
  - \* Safety Barrier Replacements, works not exceeding a value of £750,000
  - \* Extreme Weather highways improvements, works not exceeding a value of £1,000,000
- 2. Authorise the Executive Director, Place and Economy, to vary the value of works orders when required, subject to;
  - i. available budget being in place.
  - ii. the reason for the variation is for genuinely unforeseen reasons leading to fundamental changes in the project plan and target cost, and that such details along with a breakdown of where costs have been varied shall be made available in full on request. the total sum of each variation not exceeding £50,000; and
  - iii. the combined value of the works order and any authorised variation(s) do not exceed the annual budgets advised above. Order variations in excess of £50,000 are to be made in consultation with the council's Internal Audit and Finance Teams.

3. Authorise the Executive Director, Place and Economy, to vary the scope of the order when required to cover other related highway works subject to the limits imposed by items 2 and 3 above and with the approval of the Executive Director of Resources, Director of Law and Governance (or authorised officers).

| 3.1  | The Peterborough Unitary Authority area is well connected and has a very effective network of cycleways, footways and highways, offering residents efficient and safe routes to navigate the city. A significant majority of these facilities are adopted highway and therefore the Council has a statutory duty to maintain the roads, footpaths and cycleways in a suitable condition to ensure safe passage. |    |                                     |     |                |  |
| In addition to supporting existing residents and businesses, Peterborough will<br>see significant growth over the coming years and a fully functional highway<br>fundamental to facilitating growth and maintaining current journey times around<br>the city. |     | Following approval of the 2023/2024 capital budget Peterborough Highway Services have been allocated £2.5m to deliver three schemes that are considered to be corporate priorities. The projects and their corresponding budget allocations are detailed below:  |  |  |  |
|     | <ul> <li>£750,000 for measures to prevent movement of the access ramp away from the footbridge and replace the affected bearings at APV Baker footbridge over Paston Parkway; an important pedestrian and cycle link between sites of residential, employment and education use.</li> <li>£750,000 to replace lengths of safety barriers along Peterborough's Parkways. Failure to complete these works would result in reduced speed limits at best or lane closures at worst, seriously impacting the ability of users to reach key destinations and creating major capacity issues on alternative routes.</li> <li>£1,000,000 to repair and resurface highway damaged as a result of extreme weather conditions causing the highway to fail. Similar to the above, failure to maintain the highway for safe travel will potentially close key routes creating a knock on effect around the city on roads that may be less suitable for increased volumes of traffic.</li> </ul> |  |  |  |
|     | Works orders will not be issued in excess of the budget values detailed above a experienced Project Managers within Highways will oversee the delivery.  |  |  |  |
|     | Milestone Infrastructure are Peterborough City Councils highways partner. Milestone have successfully completed a number of major schemes for Peterborough City Council since 2013 and their demonstrable ability to deliver and positive performance has resulted in a 5 year contract extension commencing in October 2023.  |  |  |  |
|     | This decision notice seeks approval to directly award the works to Milestone Infrastructure via the existing Peterborough Highways Term Service Contract.  |  |  |  |
|     | Issuing the works directly to Milestone allows significant efficiencies in both time and money<br>as a new and full procurement exercise is not required. The recommendation gives<br>confidence in the quality of the work and will contribute to the revenue rebate agreed within<br>the Peterborough Highways term service contract when specified income thresholds are<br>achieved.   |  |  |  |
| 4.  | CORPORATE PRIORITIES   |  |  |  |
| 4.1 | Approval of the recommendation will ensure that the maintenance and improvement of the highway network is delivered in a timely manner by Peterborough City Council's highways partner; essential to maintain current journey times and support growth. Within the Contract there are a number of key and added value performance indicators that ensure the contract considers carbon usage in all of its operations and uses cleaner and greener solutions where possible.   |  |  |  |
|     | Approving the recommendation will ensure that we are able to continue to provide a safe, efficient and effective network of roads, footways and cycleways; that offer strong sustainable travel options; is capable of supporting growth and continues to connect residents to areas of education, employment, health services and leisure.  |  |  |  |
|     | There will be a negative impact overall. The nature of the projects means that there will be reasonably high levels of carbon embodied within the materials and working methods. Milestone use a carbon calculator to assess the materials used to allow embodies carbon to be reduced as far as possible. Small increases in electricity and heating use will arise through the use of welfare units. Waste will be recycled where possible. However, failure to  |  |  |  |

|     | approve the recommendation in the CMDN will result in reduced speed limits and increased congestion on the City's high-speed roads leading to reduced air quality. It is important that the works take place to limit any changes to traffic volumes and congestion as much as possible. The environmental impact of the Peterborough Highways Contract will be monitored.     |

| 5.  | CONSULTATION   |
| 5.1 | Budget consultation was completed during the approval process of the Medium Term<br>Financial Strategy decision reference – FEB23/CMDN/82  |
| 5.2 | Where required local communication will take place prior to the works commencing on site.<br>This will include statutory notices and advanced warning signage on site to advise the public<br>of closures and work durations.  |
|     | This recommendation was considered at CLT on the 8th March 2023.   |
|     | The budget request was supported by the Council's Capital and Transformation Review Group on the 2nd March 2023 and approval to proceed was agreed at Capital Programme Board on 9th March 2023.   |
| 6.  | ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES OR IMPACT   |
| 6.1 | It is expected that the recommendation will be approved, allowing the works to be completed<br>before the end of the 2023/2024 financial year and offering efficient use of budget. Approval<br>will ensure that the highway network remains safe for use, maintains efficient journey times<br>across the authority area and continues to support sustainable travel options. |
|     | Furthermore, approval of the recommendation will significantly reduce procurement time<br>and allow contractors to be on site as soon as possible. Early occupation of site will increase<br>programme certainty over the period of the funding.   |
| 7.  | REASON FOR THE RECOMMENDATION  |
| 7.1 | Peterborough City Council has a statutory obligation to maintain the highway in a safe and passable condition, this includes roads, footways and cycleways. Following the budget approval in February there is corporate capital funding allocated in 2023/2024 to deliver:  |
|     | <ul> <li>* APV Baker Bridge Improvements</li> <li>* Highways repairs and resurfacing for damage caused by Extreme weather events</li> <li>* Safety barrier repairs in areas where safety barriers have failed.</li> </ul>  |
|     | Failure or delays delivering these projects will have significant impact on the City's transport<br>networks and severely impact resident's ability to move around the city. In severe cases we<br>may have to result to closing roads and key pedestrian links until a time when the works<br>can be completed.   |
|     | Using the existing Peterborough Highway Services Term Service contract allows significant procurement efficiencies in both time and money and ensures that the works are completed by a partner that has genuine interest in the city.   |
|     | Furthermore, there is a clause in the PHS contract that agrees a monetary rebate should certain throughput thresholds be achieved. The £2.5m allocated to deliver these projects is equivalent to 25% of the value required in order to achieve the maximum rebate.  |
| 8.  | ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED   |

| 8.1  | The decision to allocate the budget to the three major highways schemes has already been approved, subsequently there is now an expectation that the schemes will be delivered within budget during the 2023/2024 financial year.  |

|      | Alternative options include completing a full competitive external tender or utilising a framework. Both options would take a significant amount of time, creating a delivery risk within the time frame in which the budget has to be used.   |
| 9.   | IMPLICATIONS   |
|      | Financial Implications   |
| 9.1  | The projects and their corresponding budgets were included in the approved 2023/24 capital programme budget. There are no additional spend implications beyond those already approved.   |
|      | Utilising the existing PHS Term Service contract will trigger higher volume rebate thresholds which will contribute to delivering the budgeted rebate at the end of the financial year.  |
|      | Legal Implications   |
| 9.2  | The Highways Act 1980 provides that the highway authority is under a duty to maintain the highway at public expense. This requires the highway to be maintained so that it is reasonably passable by the ordinary traffic of the area. Failure to maintain the public highway could result in a risk that the authority may not meet its legal duty to maintain the highway. |
|      | The Peterborough Highway Services Contract was procured under the Competitive Dialogue Procedure (regulation 18 of the Public Contracts Regulations 2006) and permits the Council to call-off further works which are within the scope of the Contract.  |

| 9.3  | No individual, group or community is expected to be disproportionately affected by the three schemes seeking procurement approval in this report.  |
