# 82. Petition for Debate - PCC to keep open Eye Youth Centre and Library Building

The lead Petitioner addressed Council and detailed why he had submitted the petition.

Councillor Howard proposed and Councillor Mohammed Farooq seconded, a motion in response to the petition. Councillor Farooq reserved his right to speak, and Council moved to debate.

After debate, Councillor Mohammed Farooq exercised his right to speak, and Councillor Howard summed up.

A recorded vote was taken on the motion (53 voting in favour, 0 voting against, 0 abstaining from voting.) The motion was **UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED** as follows:

Council acknowledges the petition from Mr McKean, and propose that the petition is referred to the February Cabinet meeting when the next steps in respect of the Eye Community Centre and Library will be considered and Cabinet will be able to take into account the petition and the comments made by members this evening as part of the consideration of the next steps. This will be in line with the work that is being done on the asset review. In the meantime, the communities and property teams, and myself as the Cabinet member responsible, will continue with the high level of engagement with Mr McKean to discuss the site and ensure when a decision is made it is suitable for the Eye community.
