- * There is already 2 Alcohol licences with metres of no. 32. but stores till 10pm. and BP Boongate has a 24 hour Alcohol license with a lock door policy!
- * we already suffer Anti social behavior, and other crimes within the area, I have enclosed pictures. I believe this will increase. Not long ago serious assault occurred within metres of no. 32. this can be checked with Police ~~etc~~
- * St Johns street is one of the busiest roads in Peterborough I believe this will increase ^{more} traffic to St Johns street.
- * parking. Most of St Johns street is double yellow lined with limited parking spaces for the existing shop on that Row next door to 32. this has caused people to park on the double yellow lines and half on foot path, if no other spaces available including on double yellow lines, vehicle ~~at~~ ~~at~~ ^{attemp to} park on BP forecourt, leaving vehicle unattended, to which ~~now~~ ² becomes a HAZARD, Health + safety risk. We are currently increasing enforcing parking restrictions due to the ³⁶ confrontation of risking the public.

1. This store is next to the school. Less than 100m. Minors will hang out near schools and ask strangers to purchase alcohol.
2. Insufficient Parking.
3. Anti-social Behaviors.

Please give further details of why you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives

1. Store is situated near to school. Minors can stand near the school because no one have concernd, near the school. They can hang out, ~~in~~ and ask a stranger to perchase alcohol for them., Use fake ID, They can steal goods and alcohol related goods.
2. There is insufficient Parking. The premises have yellow line outside, this area can park varound six vehicals only. There are more shaps. and this parking effect to parents who drop children to school, Emergency vehicals and pedestrians.
3. As a local resident, I am concerned Peterborough Council granted high number of

licence premises offering 'off sales' all within a short distance and the area is near to schools.
Availability of alcohol in such close ~~prox~~ proximity to these activities will cause a rise in calls to service for police.

How to make a representation

The statutory representation period begins the day after a valid application is received by the licensing authority and lasts for 28 consecutive days. During this time there must be at least one public notice in a local paper and a blue A4 public notice displayed on site for 28 consecutive days. The application will also appear on the public register.

Any representations must relate to one of the four licensing objectives below:

Prevention of crime and disorder

This relates to any crime, disorder or anti-social behavior in connection with the management of the premises. The licence holder cannot be responsible for the conduct of individuals once they leave the premises.

Public safety

This relates to the safety of the public on the premises - such as fire safety, lighting and first aid.

The prevention of public nuisance

This can relate to hours of operation, noise and vibration, noxious smells, light pollution and litter.

The protection of children from harm

This relates to protecting children from the activities carried out on the premises whilst they are on the premises. The law already provides special protections for children, such as making it illegal for children under 18 to buy alcohol. We recommend that if you wish to object to an application for a premises licence, you use the representation form.

Representations (objections) may not be made anonymously. Any representations that are received will be included in a report to the hearings panel. This report will be a public document and will be circulated to the parties involved prior to the hearing.

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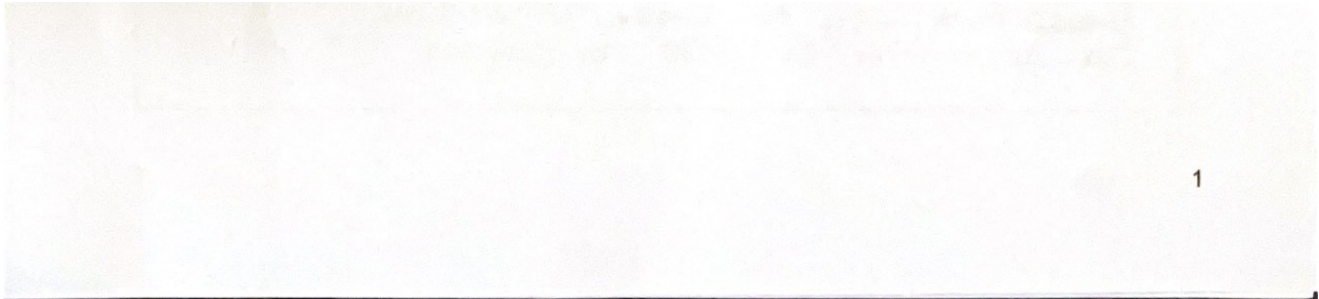

Section D: Your concerns

Please summarise your concerns about this application:

1. As a local resident I am concerned that we already have 2 off-licence shops within a few metres of each other and the Polish Shop. The Shop at Brongate has a 24 hour off-licence licence and the Store next to the Polish Shop at 36 St. Johns Street. All 3 Premises are on the same side of the road with Postcode PE15 2AD.
2. There is insufficient parking. The parade has double yellow lines outside it. Where will customers + delivery vehicles park? There are double yellow lines on both sides of the road.
3. St Johns Street is one of the busiest roads into town centre.
4. The Store is next to a school, and will be frequented by children on way to school and back.
5. There is no safe crossing over the road. That is pedestrian crossing.

Please give further details of why you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives

1. Antisocial behaviour is already an issue on the parade. This is attacks, robbery and graffiti on walls. An alcohol licence will add to disturbances in the area.
2. There is insufficient to no parking available. There are double yellow lines outside the parade. Parking here reduces visibility of traffic. This is a concern for pedestrians, cyclists and elderly people.
3. Pedestrians, children and cyclists trying to avoid the store cannot cross over safely for lack of visibility of parked vehicles and no safe route.
4. There are many incidents that require police presence in this part of Eastgate. Many assaults have been reported to the police. An alcohol licence without a lock door policy in this area is an accident waiting and a risk to the community.
5. There is concern that the amount of litter + rubbish already discarded in the parade area will greatly increase with increased activity.
