10 July 2024	Councillor Jamil, Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport	Tackling Flytipping in Peterborough	The Climate Change and Environment Scrutiny Committee recommended that the Environment and Climate Change team investigates the possibility that flytipping is collected in all areas across the city regardless of whether the land is unadopted, unregistered, owned by the housing associations.	<p>Response from Officers:</p> <p>Officers have reviewed the key implications of this recommendation, as follows -</p> <p>Financial- the council currently collects all fly-tipping found on its land and on land that is classified as 'unregistered', putting a significant financial burden on the authority. Similarly many private landowners, including RSL's, proactively collect waste disposed on their land. Any change to the current process would have implications in terms of: increasing cost (even if costs could theoretically be passed on to private owners this is administratively cumbersome and offers no guarantee that payment would be received), where companies have existing employees undertaking this work there maybe TUPE implications. The council does</p>	Response awaiting Committee review.

				<p>not have the resources to extend the current service provision.</p> <p>Investigative powers - the council is able to investigate fly-tipping on privately owned land if requested to do so by the landowner. The changes proposed by this recommendation would not impact this. As such, officers propose contacting large landowners across the city to remind them that the council is able to do this on their request with the aim of successfully prosecuting more offenders.</p> <p>As such, unfortunately, officers do not recommend that this is taken forward.</p>
