Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Licensees should note that the under enclosed Mandatory conditions should be read in conjunction with the granted licence and these conditions shall be enforceable where relevant to the operation of the premise and its activities.

Supply of alcohol (Premises Licence)

This registration authorises the supply of alcohol subject to the following conditions:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when
 - (a) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3.
 - (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (i) a holographic mark or
 - (ii) an ultraviolet feature.

4. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.—(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision (where supervisors are engaged this condition applies)

5. All door supervisors will be Security Industry Authority registered.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Crime and Disorder

6. The need for SIA at the premises will be risk assessed on a regular basis. SIA will be employed if requested in writing by the Police or Licensing Authority. If SIA are employed a bound book must be maintained by the premises licence holder containing the following details for SIA door staff; full name, SIA badge number, full agency details through which they have been allocated to work at the premises, time they began and completed their duty. This book must be kept for a minimum period of 12 months and must be made available for inspection by authorised officers upon request.
7. The premises licence holder will ensure that a digital CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.informationcommissioner.gov.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
8. A minimum of 16 CCTV cameras will be installed at the premises, a minimum of one camera will cover the frontage of the premises.
9. CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions in particular facial recognition. Cameras must cover the entire licensed area (including the frontage of the premises).
10. CCTV equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped and must be retained for a minimum period of 28 consecutive days.
11. The premises licence holder must ensure at all times that an appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format and hand this footage over to the Police / Local Authority upon reasonable request, but in any event, within 24 hours.
12. All images downloaded must be provided in a format that can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software.
13. All incidents of crime and disorder occurring at the premises and details of

occasions when the police are called to the premises must be recorded in a log book by relevant staff including the staff members name the date and time of the incident.

14. All refusals of age restricted products including will be recorded in detail within the daily log book.
15. All staff will be trained with regards to the sale of alcohol under the Licensing Act 2003 prior to making any sales. This training must be ongoing, logged and available for inspection on request by the Police and authorised council officers at any reasonable time.
16. No Beer/Cider/Lager above 6.5% Abv will be sold at the premises. Alcohol will only be sold to persons purchasing other non-alcoholic items. No single cans of beer or cider will be sold.

Public Safety

17. A fire risk assessment required under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) will be completed and be available for inspection by an authorised officer.
18. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises
19. Valid public liability insurance must be kept in force and a copy of the schedule must be available for inspection by an authorised officer.

Public Nuisance

20. The placing of bottles into receptacles outside the premises shall take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
21. Receptacles for waste shall be emptied regularly to minimise nuisance smells.
22. Adequate and suitable (lidded) receptacles shall be provided to receive and store refuse from the premises/site. Receptacles for refuse storage shall be maintained in a clean condition.
23. The placing of any waste into receptacles outside the premises shall take place at times that will minimise disturbance to nearby properties.
24. All deliveries to the premises will be between 6am and 9pm.
25. Clear visible notices will be placed at the entrance / exits asking patrons to respect the needs of local residents and disperse the area quietly.

26. Any refuge on the frontage of the premises will be regularly cleared.

Protection of Children from Harm

27. The 'Challenge 25' initiative to prevent sales of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age will be implemented at the premises and signage will be prominently placed within the premises advertising the fact that the premises operates the 'Challenge 25' initiative.
28. Any person selling or supplying alcoholic drink must do so under the authority of a personal licence holder and must ask for a photo ID proof of age where they have reason to believe that the individual may be less than 25 years of age.
29. A refusal log will be accurately maintained on every refusal made in relation to the attempted purchase of alcohol by a juvenile or intoxicated person.
