- No adults allowed on the stage, all young people;

- Hopes to change attitudes towards young people.

6. Community Action Plans

The Neighbourhood manager gave an update on the Community Action Plan (CAP) for the Neighbourhood Area including:

- Daytime and evening consultations were held;
- Areas for actions highlighted on map of the area;
- Will be 2 versions; a short concise one and a detailed version;
- Will include priorities for the area;
- Currently populating the plan with data from all the consultations and across the neighbourhood;
- Will align with partners and other service providers and a draft to be presented in September;

The Neighbourhood Manager asked how everyone should be kept informed of the CAP until September. Comments and responses to questions included:

- Bretton PC liaise with Parish Councils, Bretton Parish has an area action plan from 5 years ago – involve young people to develop actions;
- Ed Murphy was done with Bretton 2010 already so sometimes seems a repetition; Frances Fox - previous council survey got replaced with Bretton 2010 vision but no actions achieved;
- Ravensthorpe, use the bi-monthly newsletter from Cllr Nawaz;
- Cllr S Dalton contact residents associations, councillor newsletters are delivered in West Ward too;
- Similar to Bretton 2010 plans which faded away but now no money for anything budget cuts should not be a reason to not move forward with plans; Neighbourhood Manager it is not always about money but also to influence existing council services:
- Adrian Chapman Bretton is the only parished area so we could have consulted differently, could meet outside to discuss how to deliver in tandem with the Parish Council;
- Disabled groups are being consulted for each Neighbourhood Area;
- Young People Service we do volunteering and therefore funds are not always needed to rectify problems if everyone

	works together; Chairman - need to spread the word and publicise this voluntary group more to get this message across; • Cllr Fletcher – South Bretton has an area that nobody owns so cannot rectify problems.; Adrian Chapman – very difficult as no-one takes responsibility, will try to unblock the bureaucracy; • Denham Hughes – building community, time bank, from Cross Keys Homes, donate time for the community and someone can pay that back for you; • Neighbourhood Manager – inspections are taking place in the area and remedial works are taking place relating to paving issues. Ratings of 1-5 are given which will then get fed into the scheme of works for the next year; • The Neighbourhood Manager confirmed that the CAP aimed to build a better community for everyone and therefore everyone's views would be sought and included. 7. Proposed Planning Application for Prison Extension	Mike Roberts introduced the proposed extension to the prison advising that the planning application had been received and the consultation was due to finish in 3 weeks time. Details of the application included: • Construction of a new, four-storey, v-shaped house block for male inmates; • Same height as existing 'star' building and same materials; • Perimeter wall will move out; • New kitchen block, relocation of sports pitch, new visitor centre; need to determine what will happen to existing visitor centre; • Relocation of public and staff parking; • Construction over about 18 months; • PCC has not allowed parking on the park land outside during construction; • Will use current staff access to enter the site; • Issues with footpaths around the site still to be resolved; • All HGV vehicles will approach via A47 and Gresley Way; • Construction works between 7.30am and 7pm and on Saturday mornings; Comments raised and responses to questions included: • The extension was applied for before the new government came to power when more prison places were needed; you have until 20 July to register your views with Planning dept; • The same planning processes must be followed for public as with private buildings; • Local Resident - Need to ensure the building is not started and then cancelled half way through • The city council cannot enforce a timescale on the completion of the building works; • The decision is currently deferred to officers.
