**APPLICATION FOR NEW STREET TRADING CONSENT IN PARK
CRESCENT, PETERBOROUGH**

I write as both a local resident and Member of Parliament for Peterborough in order to formally **OPPOSE** the application for a trading license for ice cream sales by Mr Wajid Hussain of Waterloo Road, Peterborough in Park Crescent, Peterborough.

I believe that such a grant of licence will have a detrimental effect on the residential amenity of local householders; will have a negative impact on traffic flows and parking availability as well as road safety implications for young children.

In addition, catering facilities are already provided for at the well-supported and popular Buttercross Café, whose owners have played such a significant part in the renaissance of Central Park over the last 18 years or so.

I think that it should also be born in mind that this application is *retrospective*, as Adam Ices have already been trading in Park Crescent, unlicensed, for a number of weeks, as I have myself recently witnessed.
